## Greenhouse Industry To Vanish Says Town Planner Len Lane

BRAMPTON—The greenhouse industry will disappear from Brampton within the next few years, a new planning board study predicts.

"I think the handwriting is on the wall," said town planner Len Lane.

"I think it would be foolish for the town not to be made aware that this will happen in the not too distant future. It will happen because there will be forces pushing the greenhouses

out and pulling them to different areas. These forces are mainly economic."

The planning board study states, "During the past 10 to 15 years the area devoted to this type of enterprise has decreased within the limits of Brampton. It is considered reasonable to assume that the greenhouse industry as a significant aspect of the land use pattern of Brampton will continue to decrease because of economic factors."

### COUNCIL BRIEFS

Russell McClure 5 Temple Road was engaged by council on Monday for the new position of assistant town foreman. The job carries a salary of \$6300 yearly.

Frank Robinson was engaged for a six week period as relief operator at the pumping station, during the summer vacations.

Sale was completed of a parcel of town-owned building land adjoining Interchem Presatite Ltd. on Armstrong Avenue for future expansion of the firm.

A \$25,000 grant was made to the YM/YWCA to assist with an August playground project which will be operated in the parks.

Fred Tucker, through his solicitor, said he will accept \$28,000 in full settlement for purchase of his Main Street house, to be demolished when rebuilding the overhead railway bridge. The town has offered him \$27,500.

Georgetown hydro commission informed council that it will require a lot 100x100, at no cost to hydro, for a planned new sub-station to serve the new housing development in the Mountainview Road area.
