O.P.P. REPORT

During the week of July 14-20 officers of Milton Detachment Ontario Provincial Police investigated 6 theft complaints, 3 disturbances, 3 liquor investigations resulting in 2 persons being charged under the Liquor Control Act, several other complaints of minor nature. A local employee was killed when a farm tractor he was operating rolled over pinning him under a mower.

A total of 8 accidents were investigated including 4 injury accidents resulting in 4 persons being injured. 4 property damage accidents. Property damage totalled \$5,505. Causes of accidents were: driver lost control, speed too fast for road and traffic conditions, fail to share highway, did not have right of way and careless driving.

There were 3 charges laid as a result of these accidents.

During this period officers patrolled a distance of 9,418 miles. A total of 79 charges were laid and 55 warnings issued. There were 21 vehicles safety checked and 47 convictions were registered in Magistrate's Court.

Highway Traffic Act Amendments

Effective September 1, 1968, amendments to the Highway Traffic Act requires a red and orange sign for slow moving vehicles to be used on farm tractors and self propelled farm implements when operating on a highway.

Another amendment prohibits anyone from travelling in a house or boat trailer when it is being operated on a highway.
