NOTICE RE: Lawn Watering Restrictions

EFFECTIVE AUGUST 1, and continuing until such time as the new No. 4 well has been in operation for a sufficient time to evaluate the performance of the installation and reach a stabilized pumping rate, the following lawn watering will apply in the Town of Georgetown.

1. Lawn watering is permitted only between the hours of six o'clock and nine o'clock in the afternoon, Eastern Daylight Saving Time.
2. Owners, tenants or occupants of dwellings with even municipal street numbers may water lawns only on even numbered days.
3. Owners, tenants or occupants of dwellings with odd municipal street numbers may water lawns only on odd numbered days.
4. The penalty for contravention is a fine of not more than \$300.00.

LAND FOR COMMUNITY FACILITIES

The owner shall dedicate land for 3 public schools, 6.7 acres each, for one separate school, 5.8 acres and for 1 high school, 11 acres. He will also dedicate a site for new municipal offices, large enough to serve 23,000 people and with land enough to expand to serve twice that many.

He will also dedicate 5% of the land area for parks, with all park land being table land.

In addition another site of 6 acres will be demanded for a community centre, either a library, indoor swimming pool or recreational facility of some kind.

To construct a new well, donate land for the well, build an iron removal plant, extend the reservoir, and put 12" mains on Mountainview and Main St. S. The estimated total cost for water is \$648,000.

SANITARY SEWERS — As usual all sanitary sewers will be built by the developer, however he will also pay the capital cost and guarantee the operating charges for an enlargement of the sewage plant, estimated at \$700,000. The capital charges on \$700,000 would be \$72,000 per year. 50% of operating costs for 11,000 people would be \$16,500 per year. Total charges \$88,500 per year.

ROADS

All roads will be paved, curbed and guttered, with five-foot sidewalk. The extension of Mountainview Rd. to the town limit will necessitate a new bridge across the west branch of the Credit. Similarly the extension of Main St. S. will necessitate a new bridge.

The owner must look after the snowploughing until 75% of houses on a street are occupied.
