**Children's Aid Plans Move to Larger Building**

Doctor Gordon Askwith said this week the Children's Aid Society headquarters will be moved into another, large building after negotiations with Halton County Council property committee are completed.

The move has been contemplated for some time by the CAS board of directors.

During this year's spring general sessions a grand jury drew attention to the lack of space and facilities at the society's cramped headquarters.

The jury recommended the CAS staff be moved in the near by Halton County Health Unit, a suggestion which the CAS board has turned down. Dr. Askwith said the board of health and the CAS had two different functions and that they needed to be separated.

A CAS committee has for several weeks been probing the possibility of new headquarters but has not yet decided upon either obtaining a building elsewhere in the area or of constructing a new one.

Dr. Askwith said: "nothing further has been done but we hope to be talking with the county next month about it."

"The property committee will be involved in discussions about the building with us."

He said the main problem was one of cramped quarters in the old premises.

Dr. Askwith said the board of health

ed to properly conduct personal interviews with people seeking the help of the society. He also criticized the small waiting room where society clients have to wait together for interviews.

**Rud Whiting Becomes Part Time Postman**

When Rud Whiting was elected June 25 to represent Halton in Ottawa he didn't know it would entail becoming a part time postman.

But since the country-wide mail strike began he has had numerous calls from people asking him to help them get out of the country.

In all, the 37-year-old former salesman has filled about 20 requests from riding residents wanting him to track down applications for passports and speed them on their way.

Shortly after his election, whiting went to Ottawa and set up an office with a secretary in the West Block on Parliament Hill. Now, when he gets a request, he calls his Ottawa office and his secretary relays his message to the External Affairs Department.

Under ordinary circumstances, when the passport is ready the secretary picks it up from External Affairs and gives it to one of Whiting's contacts who makes regular trips between Ottawa and Halton.

On a rush job the passport is sent back to Halton via bus.
