Conservation Week Success Hope Now for Yearly Event

Halton MP Rud Whiting, whose idea of a conservation week in Halton — the first in Ontario — turned out a booming success, has recommended it become an annual event throughout Canada.

His recommendation received unanimous support at the Halton Region Conservation Authority meeting.

"I will be happy to bring it up in the House," Whiting added, hinting the recommendation might be encompassed in his maiden speech in Ottawa.

Resigned Position

Whiting made the suggestion as his parting shot as an authority member. He resigned last week to take up his political duties.

O.P.P. Weekly Report

During the week of July 28, August 3rd, officers of North Halton detachment, Ontario Provincial Police, investigated 3 theft complaints, 2 breaches, 4 disturbances, 1 fraud, 2 assaults, resulting in 1 person being charged, 2 trespasses, 2 malicious damage complaints, 1 liquor investigation resulting in 1 charge, 1 person charged under the Motor Vehicle Accident Claims Act, 1 stolen auto reported but proven unfounded.

A total of 15 accidents were investigated including — 1 fatal accident in which the driver was fatally injured when his car lost traction and went out of control and was struck broadside by a truck, 3 injury accidents resulting in 3 persons being injured, 11 property damage accidents. The total property damage for the week was \$9,010.

Barry Humphreys, authority chairman, said: "I'm tickled to death the way everything went with Conservation Week. I think we should start planning to increase this whole approach to conservation."

"It makes me feel very proud of what everyone did in that regard".

September Talks

Whiting's resolution will be introduced to the September biennial conservation conference.

Humphreys said the authority was writing a full report on Halton's success on Conservation Week. It will be later submitted to the minister of energy and resources.

"This whole attitude and feeling should be spread throughout Ontario and across Canada," he said.
