

# Study Pays Dividends Prepares 22 for College

Last May, President J. M. Porter announced that Sheridan College would set up a program to encourage high school dropouts to get back into the educational stream. As a result of newspaper announcements and advertisements, a class of 24 students, mostly from the Peel-Halton area, began an intensive upgrading course in mathematics, science and English in June. Some students had been out of school as long as five years.

On August 9th, 22 of these students completed the course and will be entering regular programs at Sheridan College in September. Those who are

entering technology programs will continue on for another 4 weeks of mathematics and science.

D. E. Hamilton, Director of Extension at Sheridan, who supervised the course, indicated that the results had exceeded everyone's expectations and ensured that similar programs would be offered at Sheridan in the future. "He stated that the most valuable result of the course was that the students had regained confidence in themselves and for that reason their chance of success in a college program was very good."

### Vacations, Charges Mean Delays in Setting Inquest Dates

Doctors on vacation, and pending charges in connection with accidents, are preventing the Halton County coroner atorney's office from setting dates for inquests.

Acting crown attorney Rip Thomas, a crown counsel with the attorney general's department in Toronto who replaced former crown attorney J. McWilliams after he was nominated to run in the last federal election, said several inquests are pending.

Mr. Thomas said that since May 8, when he took over in Halton County, he has been involved with four or five inquests. Some six or seven are currently on the books with only one inquest date set yet.

He said the most important purpose of inquests is to either reveal unknown facts about a case, warn the public of a particular danger, or to determine the cause of death.

Mr. Thomas said that under the Coroner's Act, inquests cannot be held prior to the hearing in court of police charges.

Witnesses on vacation, people involved in mishaps being treated in hospital and the time needed to round up all reports also delay inquests, he said.
