"Close Down" - Inspector Orders Rosslake Resort

Rosslake Resort, two miles west of town on the Cheek Line has been ordered shut down by Halton County health inspector A. J. Powell.

Powell told Halton crown attorney Ronald Thomas that the Red Cross and the department of tourism are also responsible for the closure.

He said the 100-acre and riding academy complex he shut down two years ago, but last month was again opened by owner Joe Ross, who announced he has plan to build a 2000 foot runway for night planes and a driving range.

Mr. Ross argues that he cannot be expected to comply with health unit regulations governing his four acre lake on his land because the health unit classifies it as a swimming pool — and has ordered it closed under health by-laws governing swimming pool requirements.
