DISCUSS REBUILDING FIRE-RAZED GRANDSYAND Reconstruction of the grandstand in the park could be subsidized to a large extent by the Department of Agriculture, if the construction was undertaken by the Georgetown Agricultural Society, mayor Joseph Gibbons told council Monday night.
