## 'Blast Dam?' Councillors Get Irate Return Blasts

The suggestion by a Chinguacousy councillor that the Huttonville dam should be "blown out" has met with a wave of protest from residents whose homes are adjacent to the structure.

"The suggestion is disgusting," said Mrs. Jenny Howard, 16 River Rd. "The dam should be repaired and a new one built."

Councillor Harold Wilson recently said it was his view that the structure should "be blown out completely."

Area residents are angered at the suggestion and feel every effort has not been expended to arrive at an acceptable, alternate solution.

Mrs. Grace Mitchell, 31 River Rd., said she believes the dam can be repaired and should be repaired.

"We never had water problems before," she said "but now many of us here are experiencing a severe shortage in our wells."

Mrs. E. Prue, 33 River Rd., said she is "just sick" over the situation. She objected to a plan whereby the Credit Valley Conservation Authority will build a dam at Meadowvale while ignoring the plight of those in the Huttonville area.

"We do not object to the Meadowvale project but feel it could be in addition to our dam. Besides the Meadowvale area will simply collect all the refuse and junk which now lies in this vicinity. They certainly will not have clean water unless our dam is repaired."

#### PART OF VICTORIA AVENUE IN THE TOWN OF GEORGETOWN

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Georgetown proposes to pass a by-law to close up and stop up all that portion of Victoria Avenue in the Town of Georgetown more particularly described as follows:

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the Town of Georgetown in the County of Halton and Province of Ontario and being composed of part of Victoria Avenue in the said Town of Georgetown as shown on Registered Plan Number 32 on file in the Registry Office for the said County, containing by admeasurement 0.022 Acres or the same more or less and which said parcel of land is more particularly described as follows:

PRESUMING that Main Street North in the Town of Georgetown has a bearing of North 43 deg. 58'30" West astronomic and relating all bearings herein thereto;

COMMENCING at the point of intersection of the North-east Limit of Main Street North with the North Limit of Victoria Avenue in the said Town of Georgetown as shown on said Registered Plan Number 32;

THENCE NORTH 74 deg., 28'30" East, along the said North Limit of Victoria Avenue, 19.34 feet to a point therein;

THENCE South 43 deg., 58'30" East, across said Victoria Avenue along a line drawn parallel to the aforesaid North-east Limit of Main Street North, 56.30 feet more or less to a point in the South Limit of Victoria Avenue;

THENCE South 74 deg., 28'30" West, along the said South Limit of Victoria Avenue 19.34 feet to the point of intersection of the said South Limit of Victoria Avenue with the said North-east Limit of Main Street North as shown on said Registered Plan Number 32;

THENCE North 43 deg., 58'30" West, along the said North-east Limit of Main Street North being also the South-west Limit of Victoria Avenue, 58.30 feet more or less to the point of commencement.

The said by-law will be dealt with at a meeting of Council to be held for the purpose of considering the said by-law on Monday, September 23rd, 1968, at 8.00 p.m. at the Municipal Building, 36 Main Street North, Georgetown.
