Claims Garage Signs Building Violation

Two large signs at the garage at the corner of Mountainview and Guelph St. were declared illegal by Cr. Jim Young Monday night.

He claimed the signs and the frame accessory building were in direct violation of the zoning by-law.

"The by-law clearly states there will be no accessory building on a corner lot," said Cr. Young. "Further, where an accessory building is permissible it must be 20 feet from the rear lot line and 50 feet from the side lot line. Neither of these conditions are met," he added.
