Offensive and defensive action went on with a crack and a crunch between the twenty-five yard lines throughout the first quarter, with no Rebel and no Trojan giving up a score.

The Trojan machine went in to action in the second quarter. Big and Tricky Tesky went over from two yards out to put Centennial ahead 6-0. The half ended with the Trojans in Rebel territory after an interception by Trojan's Beattie.

Georgetown had trouble getting untracked in the second half. The Trojan defense put on good pressure, kept the Rebels tied up in their own end, and were aided by the elements in their defense — a cloud burst. Georgetown, forced to kick from deep in their own zone, lost two points when the snap went wild and Bill Sykes had to fall on the ball in our end zone.

The Rebels finally got moving in the fourth quarter. Stewart, the Georgetown quarterback, used the running skill of Bull, Hills, Francis, and Cook to rick up the field for a major score. Barry Cook ran the ball in from the 23 yard line. The convert attempt hit the goal post. The score: 8-6. The Rebel defense strengthened and shone with Fogal, Hills, Bottomly, Cook, Bull and Walker putting

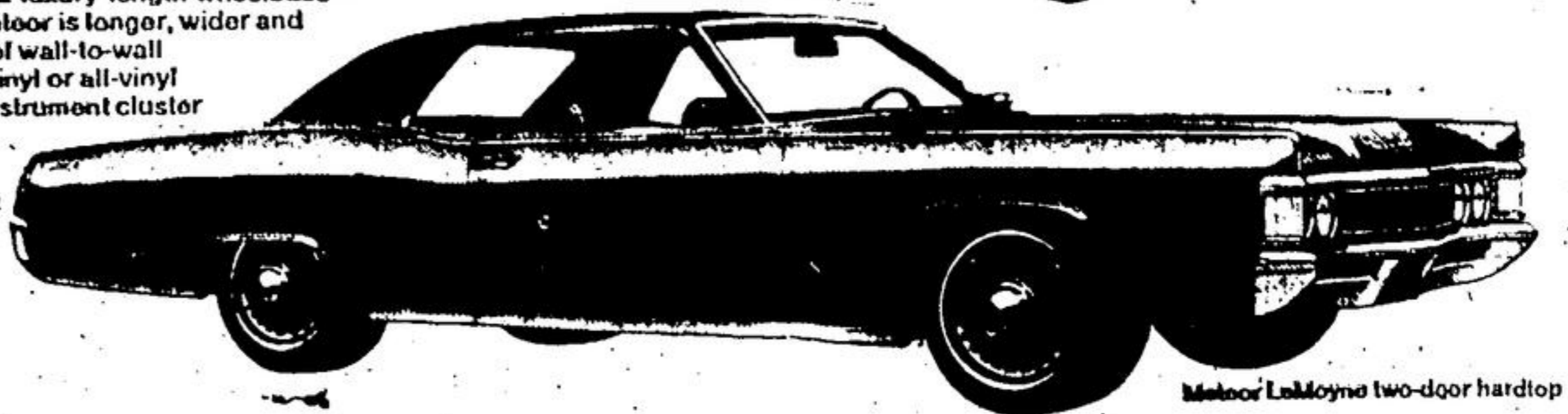

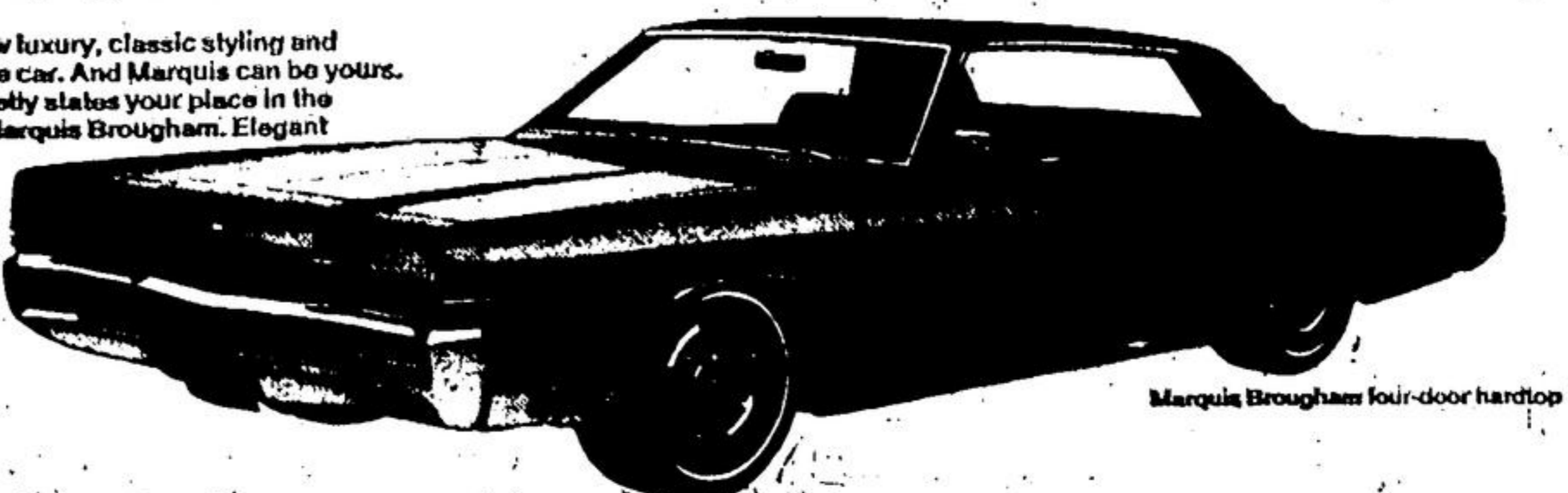

The Juniors came home victorious — and counting up Sargent's yards rushing. Mr. Bingham assured Bob he only covered 239 yards!

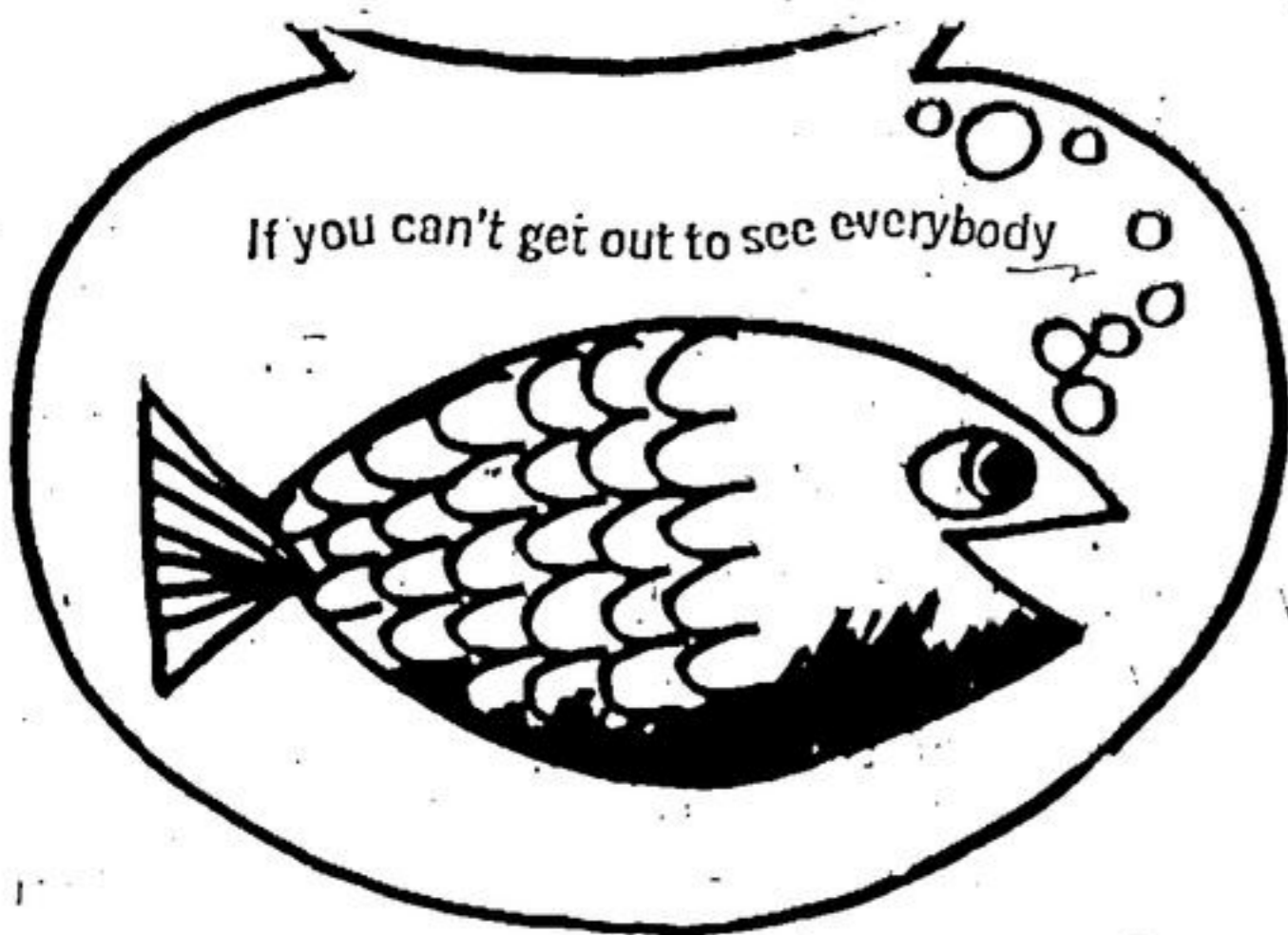
