The groom's mother, who also received, wore a light pink brocade dress with matching coat and pink and white accessories and a corsage of deep red sweetheart roses.

Travelling through New York state for their honeymoon, the bride wore a yellow linen suit with white accessories and a corsage of white gardenias and roses.

## Find Bodies in Car Suspect Murder-Suicide

Investigation is continuing today into what police describe as the murder-suicide of Janette and Ronald Beers, last Wednesday.

Chinguacousy police chief Ken Sider confirmed that an inquest will be held into the double fatality. He said no date for the inquest has been set.

It was at the intersection that Chinguacousy constable John Bottomley, parked in a cruiser nearby, heard a girl scream. The car took off at a high rate of speed with the officer in pursuit.

After turning off Highway 7 on to the Second Line West, and with the pursuing cruiser forced to drop back because of dense clouds of dust, it was finally observed by the officer parked in front of a farm owned by Les Cation.

When the officer approached the car he found the Beers couple in the front seat, both apparently dead of gunshot wounds with a .410 gauge shotgun beside them.

An autopsy later confirmed death was due to gun shots. Police have reported finding a note which "indicated a planned situation."

The couple had been estranged. Mrs. Beers had been living in St. Catharines.

They had separated several weeks ago in Alaska where the husband had been employed as a pipeline worker.

## THE DISTRICT AT A GLANCE

**CAMPBELLVILLE** — A plan of subdivision in the village of Campbellville opposite the ball park could increase the population of the village by about 30 per cent. If it meets approval through proper channels. The plans call for construction of 40 houses costing approximately \$30,000 each.

**MALTON** — More than 300 residents jammed the village hall in Malton, Thursday night, and unanimously voted against the proposed route of the Bellfield Freeway which would cut the village in two. It would eliminate about 50 homes, many serviced building lots, a separate school and isolated parts of the community from public and high schools.

**OAKVILLE** — Police Chief Fred W. Oliver has called on this community at large to help his department wipe out the use of drugs by teenagers. In a statement issued Friday he said "Starting tonight the Oakville Police Department will enforce a 10 p.m. curfew on children under 16 years of age."

**MILTON** — Milton's senior citizens housing project has been shot down in flames and the \$750,000 has been practically thrown down the drain, according to J. M. Ledwith, Halton County Council last week rejected the Milton Rotary Club scheme to purchase a strip of land near Halton Manor for the project. A Club official, Mr. Ledwith called it "short-sightedness."

**BRAMPTON** — Students here have failed to win the right to take pot shots in public at the school system. The high school board, listened to a deputation from a local newspaper and then turned thumbs down on their proposal to allow students to air their unencensored views.
