He said both Morden and Maloney died from ruptures to the main arteries leading to their hearts - "A very common kind of killing injury when the steering column is pressed against the chest." Hunter died from severe third degree burns and lived only a short while sufficlent to inhale some smoke.

David Armstrong, a Georgeown mechanic who examined the vehicles after the accident said he found no sign of mechanical damage that might have happened prior to the collision. He said there appeared to be no fallure as a result of excesavely worn parts on either


