B & P Club Members Attended Overseas Congress

Miss Jean Mackenzie and Miss Olive Logan of the Georgetown Club were among 250 members of the Canadian Federation of Business and Professional Women's Clubs just returned to Canada by charter plane, after having attended the 11th Congress of the International Federation Business and Professional Women, held in London, England. Thirty three countries were represented, with a total registration of nearly 1700. The Canadians formed the largest group from any one country. All sessions of the Congress were presided over by Lady Barbara Littlewood, President of the International Federation. The president for the next triennium, elected at the Congress is Miss Patience Thoms of Australia, a leading journalist, in that country, Edmonton Alberta, is to be the locale of the next Congress. In 1971, with Canadian members as hostesses.

Immediately prior to the Congress, the Canadian Federation held its biennial Convention at Quebec City. Mrs. Margaret E. Ashdown, Director and Corporate Secretary of Canadian Coleman Co., Ltd., Toronto, was elected National President for the ensuing term, and Miss Charlotte Vah'Ohie, was elected 1st Vice president. Subjects dealt with at this Conference included the Royal Commission on the Status of Women, Observance of Human Rights Year, the changing role of women in the national economy, and the need for educational opportunities and counselling for mature women wishing to re-enter the labour force.
