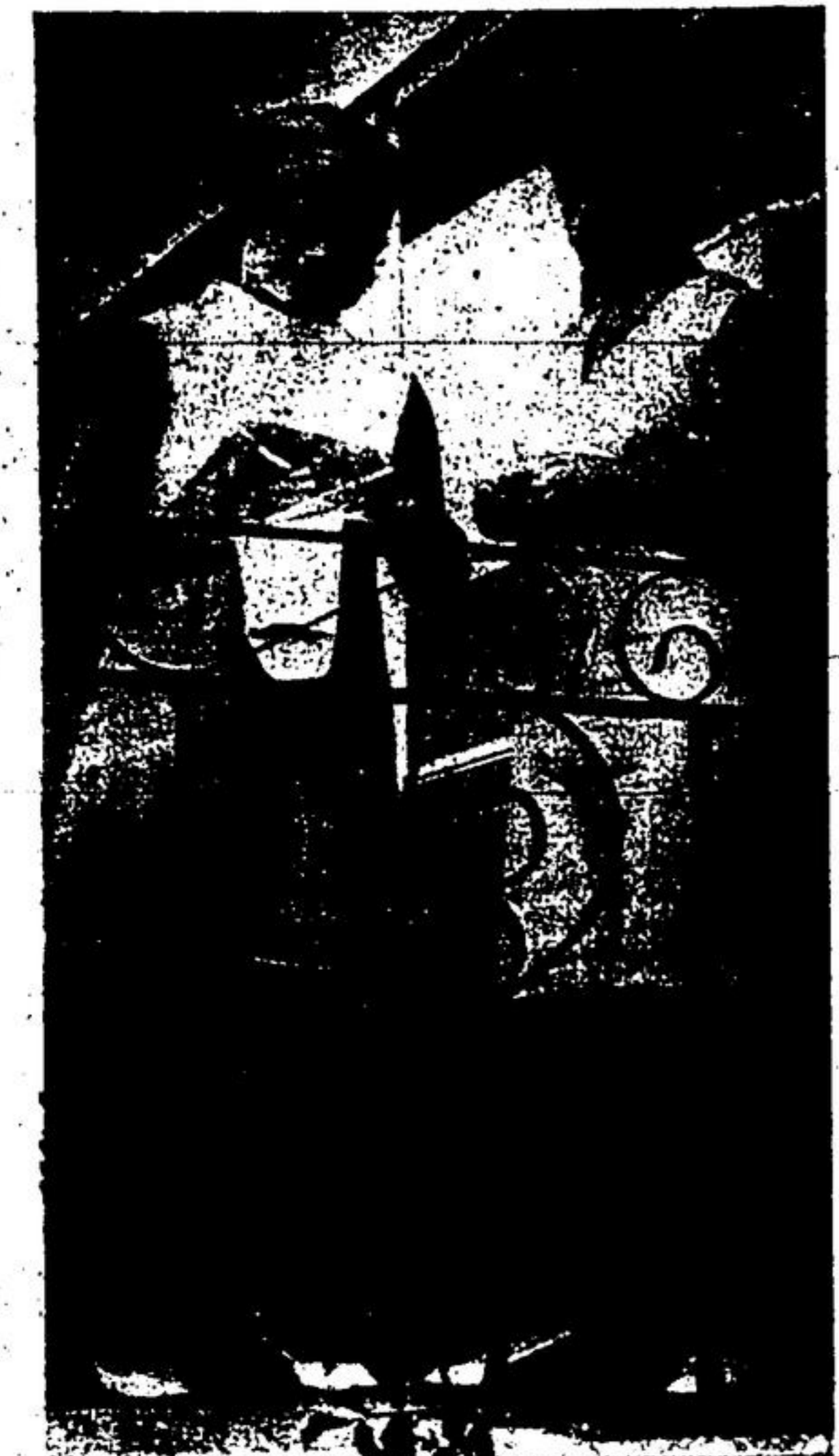


Liberal Expense \$11,700 To Win Halton Riding

FOR THIRTY-EIGHT YEARS SHE WAS "THE EGG LADY"

"The egg lady", a familiar figure for thirty-eight years, has disappeared from the local scene.

Mrs. Neilson Stark started delivering eggs around Georgetown thirty-eight years ago, and was still delivering to one of her first customers when she gave up the business a few weeks ago.

Eight hundred dozen eggs a week were taken from house to house, just before she quit. The business grew with little effort from "the egg lady", who never canvassed for new customers, but was always recommended by a neighbour or friend.

As new subdivisions were built, someone always knew someone who knew Mrs. Stark. Frequently she had been delivering for months before she became anything more than "the egg lady."

"It was very interesting, going around meeting people," says Mrs. Stark, "and many became friends."

She gave up the business due to her husband's ill-health.

Seventy-Five Bureau Firemen Will Parade

A school children's poster competition, a church parade and fire hall open houses are featuring this year's Fire Prevention Week activities in Halton County. Fire Prevention Week is being celebrated across Canada October 6-13.

Each of Halton's 5 fire departments is arranging a special program in its own municipality, under the guidance of Halton County Fire Prevention Bureau. Before this special week is over, we hope every man, woman and child in the county will be more aware of the dangers of fire, and better prepared to prevent fires before they start.

Two Bureau programs involve the entire county. Hundreds of Grade five elementary and separate school students in the county are submitting posters in the home. The top boy and girl in the county will be selected by a panel of outside judges and they, along with four "honourable mention" prizewinners will be honoured at a Bureau dinner in Milton in November or who went to the flea circus.

Open houses at the fire halls, school fire drills, distribution of special literature and commercial and industrial building inspections are on the program too.
