

60 Study Ballet, Expect Some Head for Career

For ten years the Vicki Lay School of Dancing has taught Georgetown aspiring dancers the art of ballet and modern jazz, and for the past four years has extended its activities into Brampton and Brantford.

At present sixty local young people are studying here, and an additional dozen travel to Brampton to study modern jazz under Brian Foley, well known choreographer for the CBC, who is affiliated with the Vicki Lay School. He is assisted by Paye Poland and Susan Hunf.

Vicki Lay is well qualified for her chosen profession, being a member of the Imperial Society of Teachers of Dancing and a member of the Canadian Dance Teachers Association.

Perhaps four of her pupils will go on to make ballet their career says Mrs. Lay who cites Veronica Nemeth as one of these. Her daughter Deanne is attending the National School of Ballet, and appeared in the Christmas production of Nutcracker Suite.

In Brampton the teachers are Mrs. Lynne Woods, and Mrs. M. Keller, both members of the C.D.T.A.

Mrs. Lay lived in town, but moved to Toronto about five years ago.
