For seventeen years the festival has been held in the Robert Little School, Acton, with as many as 1500 children participating, disrupting the regular classes in the school.

This year, likely the senior classes will have their festival at Stewarttown school on one day, the junior and primary classes at Brookville the next day, with the evening program in either Acton or Milton high school gym. These possibilities will all be investigated.

Principals of both Stewarttown and Brookville school are willing to undertake hosting the children, with the accompanying necessity of rearranging classes.

The final program may simply be a concert, without any competition.

About 25 teachers, music supervisors, principals and interested parents attended the annual meeting in the teachers' room of the Robert Little school in Acton.

Articles Sell Fast at H.O.P.E. Workshop Open House

"We have never had such a big open house," Mr. and Mrs. H. Isham, managers of Halton Opportunity Product Enterprises workshop for adult retardates reported following the best open house in the workshop's history.

Around 150 visitors stopped in Wednesday afternoon or evening of last week to see the Hornby workshop (a converted one-room schoolhouse on the Base Line) and watch the trainees working at a variety of projects. Dozens of crafts articles made by the trainees were sold on the spot and when the supply ran out, orders were taken for more. The workshops specialty, "Chip'n'Dip" made of wood, waxes and bottle caps were the biggest sellers but there was also a variety of decorative articles, Christmas cards, dolls and ceramics work.

Visitors were also impressed with the industrial jobs the trainees are doing — sorting and packaging nuts and bolts, setting up samples of wool products, hooking rugs and rewebbing lawn chairs. Manager Harry Isham says the industrial work is pouring in almost daily and is producing much-needed revenue for the workshop. A government grant is being received but the workshop project relies on paying jobs and the sale of crafts to survive.

There are presently fourteen trainees at HOPE, 5 of them residents of Halton Manor and several of the visitors at Wednesday's open house were Manor officials who expressed pleasure at the progress the trainees are making.
