Georgetown high school's junior gridgers added another win to the heap Friday, beating Guelph Junior Spartans 21-18 in an exciting season's home game ender.

The game started off with a bang when Juri Peepre came around on an end sweep and a 70 yard sprint for a quick opening in the score. In this first play of the game, crisp Spartan blocking allowed Peepre to make the count 6-0.

The rest of the half high lighted four more touchdowns, two for each team. For the Georgetown Rebels, Bob Sargent on a screen pass, went for his first major and later in the half came up with another one. For Centennial, Ed Duncan ran a 25 yard dash after charging through the centre and Bruce Maltby on a pass in the end zone ended the first half with Centennial leading Georgetown 18-12.

### The 10 Commandments Of Hunter Safety

- 1) TREAT EVERY GUN AS IF IT WERE LOADED.
- 2) BE SURE OF YOUR TARGET BEFORE YOU SQUEEZE THE TRIGGER. Positively identify the target as legal game. Never shoot at sounds or movements in the bush.
- 3) NEVER POINT A GUN AT ANYTHING YOU DO NOT WANT TO KILL. Not even when the gun is not loaded. Avoid all horseplay while handling a gun; a gun is not a toy.
- 4) ALWAYS CARRY YOUR GUN SO THAT THE MUZZLE IS UNDER CONTROL AT ALL TIMES. Sudden jars sometimes release the trigger. By safe gun carries, the hunter controls the muzzle even if he stumbles or trips.
- 5) GUNS MUST ALWAYS BE UNLOADED WHEN CARRIED INTO CAMP OR WHEN NOT IN USE. Take one last check of your gun before entering camp. Actions should be open, or guns taken down, when the hunt is completed. Guns should be carried to the hunting area in cases.
- 6) MAKE SURE BARREL AND ACTION ARE CLEAR OF OBSTRUCTIONS. If the muzzle touches the ground or other objects, always check for obstructions. Remove oil and grease from the bore before firing. Only carry ammunition in the gun you are using.
- 7) UNATTENDED GUNS SHOULD BE UNLOADED. Guns and ammunition should be stored separately, beyond the reach of children or careless adults. In the field, leave guns aside and unloaded during lunch or smoke breaks with other hunters.
- 8) NEVER CLIMB A FENCE OR JUMP A DITCH WITH A LOADED GUN. Place gun on the other side of the fence before climbing (at another post). Never pull a gun through a fence or other obstruction by the muzzle. Stay out of trees during the hunting season.
- 9) NEVER SHOOT AT FLAT OR HARD OBJECTS, OR THE SURFACE OF WATER. You can not control the direction of a ricochet. When sighting in, be sure your backstop is adequate.
- 10) AVOID ALCOHOLIC DRINKS BEFORE OR DURING THE HUNT. Drinking dulls the vision, distorts the aim and impairs the judgement. If you drink, wait until the hunt is over before imbibing.

Two touchdowns by Barry Cock were all Georgetown senior Rebels needed to beat Guelph Centennial Spartans in a District 10 football contest in Georgetown park Friday.

Aided by the interceptions of Dan Wright and Brian Beattie, Charles Winegard made good a Centennial field goal that kept the Spartans lead for most of the game. A little later, Winegard completed a pass for 25 yards and John Brubaker another 25 for the first touchdown. Brubaker was able to score on a fake-kick play manoeuvred into a run and gave Centennial a 10-0 lead.

The second quarter opened with Barry Cock running an unexpected 80 yard sweep. The convert was good as the Rebels narrowed the gap to a three point spread.

The last half of the game showed Georgetown in the stronger position as the ball hardly ever left the Spartan half of the field with Centennial trying hard to keep Rebels at bay.

During the third quarter, Spartans succeeded in keeping Georgetown scoreless, although at times it seemed a Rebel score seemed imminent. Finally resistance seemed to fail as Rick Peavoy, with a dive play through the centre, ran forward for a major. But, as luck would have it, the scoring play was flagged and not counted.

Play became tense as Centennial still held the lead. Cock, after a slight injury, came back on the field and put the ball on the Centennial three yard line, after having to give up the ball. Bill Slinger, Centennial quarterback was tackled on the one and after the third down punt by Centennial, the Rebels charged again, this time successful, with a 20 yard run by Cock.
