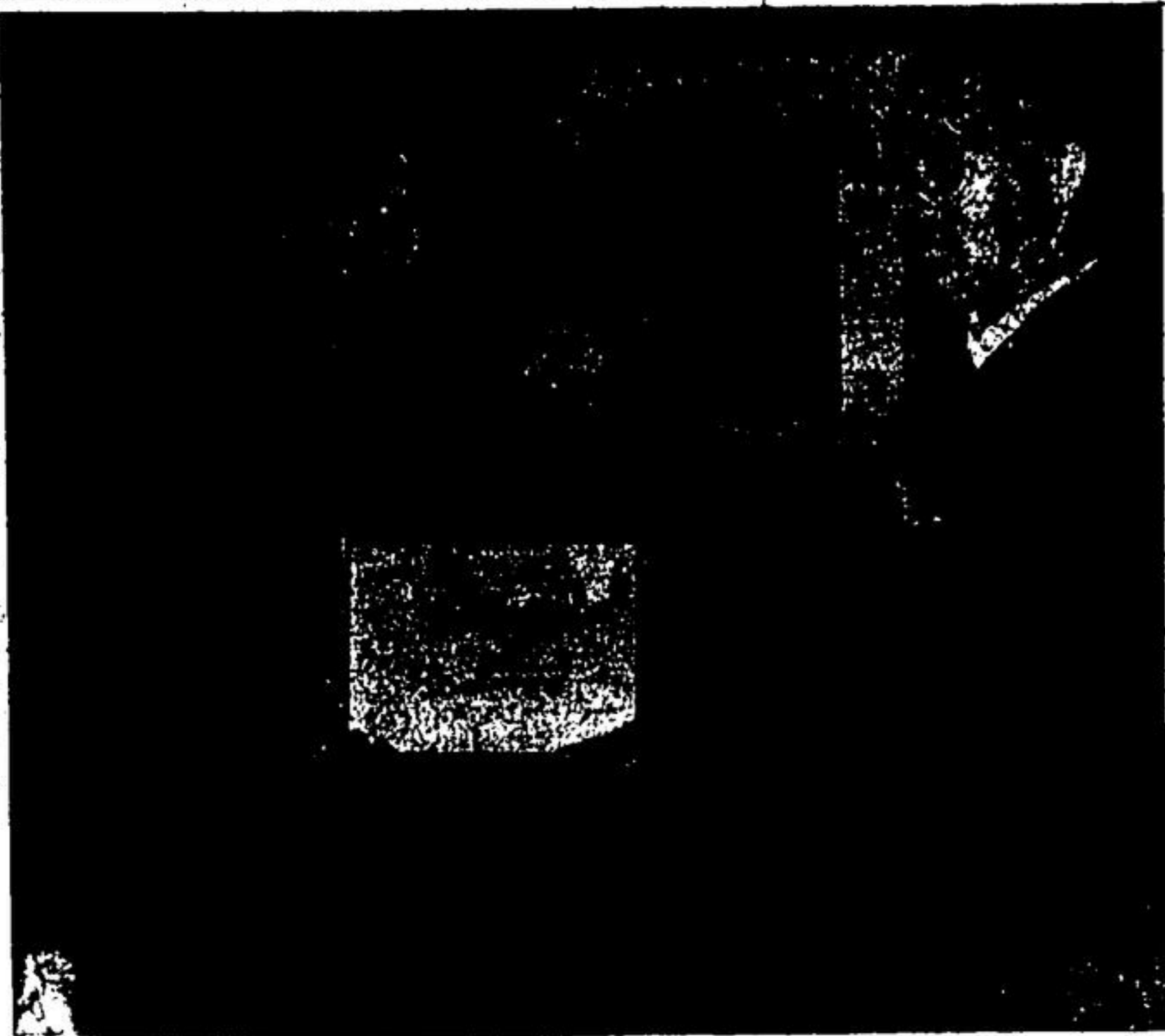


**BUD SNOW RECEIVES CERTIFICATE**

The unusually large audience was held spellbound by the wit and humour and sparkling personality of Miss Louise Cowan, guest speaker. Blinded by an accident in her childhood, Miss Cowan holds a Master's Degree in Social Work and is CNIB's National Director of Welfare and Home Teaching Services.

**Realtors Donate \$1,000 For Education Program**

Area realtors were warned last week that "unless people actively engaged in real estate become interested in educating the public in how to buy and sell property, others, much less suitably equipped will walk in and assume the role."

Speaking to realtors at Georgetown Golf and Country Club, James Richardson, education administrator of the Ontario Real Estate Board, acted on behalf of that body in accepting a \$1,000 cheque donation from the local realtors to further an education program of the parent organization.

William Sunnucks of Sunnucks Real Estate, Georgetown, president of the area real estate board, made the cheque presentation.

Mr. Richardson commended for the benefit of those present by pointing out that it was only a few years ago that brokers and salesmen could enter the field simply by expressing the desire.

"In 1960 a fledgling broker need not have any experience in the field to be granted a license to practice," he said.

"The same thing held good for salesmen. They didn't even have to pass an examination."

Mr. Richardson said that education within the industry had changed all this. "Our own efforts have been responsible for upgrading the business to the status of a profession and we have been successful in attracting the very highest calibre people to our ranks."

He said that in 1966 more than \$200,000 will be spent in Ontario to educate members of the CRPB in various aspects of operations.

"This indicates a very rapid advancement in a very short time," he said, "but it is far from being enough. We who are actively engaged in buying and selling real estate are in the best position to help educate the public," he said. "The indus-

try simply must take the lead in this respect because there are others waiting in the wings to capitalize on our shortcomings."

Mr. Richardson said the community colleges will play a greater role in real estate education than any other teaching facility.

He said that he, personally, has been approached by Sheridan College administrators in Brampton, seeking assistance from the industry to hold courses for potential salesmen and brokers.

I strongly urge your real estate fraternity to take advantage of this ready-made situation and offer whatever help may be deemed advisable and available."

He concluded his remarks by saying "We live in a world of change and the real estate industry thrives on change. Never have the opportunities nor the challenge been greater."
