

Mountsberg Technician Speaker to Naturalists

The Georgetown and District Naturalists Club learned of conservation efforts in Halton at Mountsberg Work Shop, October meeting when Frank Timmermans of the Halton Region Conservation Authority was the guest speaker.

Mr. Timmermans is the Wildlife technician stationed at the Mountsberg Work Shop. Mountsberg has a 510 acre lake within a 750 acre game reserve. Mr. Timmermans told of the coot, wood ducks, and Canada goose nesting in this area and of the plan to introduce quail and wild turkeys next year. He said the Conservation Authority plans to collect every species of North American wildlife at Mountsberg which is used as a nature educational centre for school children who visit it three or four times a year. There are twelve species of fern and many wildflowers including the pitcher plant growing there, he said. During the discussion following his address, many aspects of conservation were expounded on hunting rules to the use of dams in controlling water pollution in our rivers. On Saturday, October 10th, a field trip to Coot's Paradise to see water birds was led by Ronald North of the Hamilton Naturalists' Club. Besides the birds, among which were the

dunlin and black-backed gull, a deer was seen. It was interesting to note black cherry and sassafras trees grow in that area. The next meeting will be held on November 10th at which time Robert Bateman will speak on Ontario flora and fauna.
