## Figure Skating So Popular Can't Accommodate Everyone

Georgetown Figure Skating Club added an hour and a half to its ice time this season, but even with that measure it failed to escape saturation. A club spokesman told The Herald this week they have had to create a waiting list for the first time in their history because of an unexpected overwhelming enrollment.

The club has 230 registrations this year, 50 more than last year, and have drawn the line there because they feel it would be impractical to attempt to accept more and still give a high calibre of instruction.

Actually the club cut off registrations at 200 last week, but after reviewing their classes, agreed to accept the additional 30 which had been placed on a waiting list. Because the arena board has turned down a request for still more ice time, this is the final expansion of class sizes, and any who sign on from this point will have to go on a waiting list and hope for an opening to be created through a pupil dropping out.
