**Patterson Ending Long Career With the O.H.A.**

Pat Patterson of Norval will resign from the Ontario Hockey Association at the end of this season. In a statement to The Herald Monday, Mr. Patterson said he arrived at the decision after some considerable thought. Giving up the various duties involved has not been easy, he said in releasing the news. "But there has to be an end sometime."

Mr. Patterson said he was terminating his long association with the O.H.A. to devote more time to his job with the chemical division of a meat packing company, his farm, and other interests.

His refereeing career started in 1935 and lasted until 1950. Some of his last officiating was in the Allan Cup finals of that year. He was appointed O.H.A.'s referee-in-chief in 1951 and during the following year acted as the C.A.H.A.'s instructor for Eastern Canada, and was also an instructor for the Dept. of Education for physical fitness in Ont.

Mr. Patterson conducted the only referees' school for European officials at Vienna, Austria and would have repeated in Czechoslovakia this season except for Russian intervention. "I have had a satisfying term," he commented.
