

# Witnesses Planning Six Month Bible Study Course

A ring of urgency will be sounded at Georgetown District High School this weekend when 1,000 Jehovah's Witnesses transform the auditorium into a place of worship for their semi-annual circuit assembly.

Highlighting the urgency of sharing fully in preaching the good news will be the Saturday evening program. John F. MacPherson, district supervisor of Jehovah's Witnesses who has been in Georgetown finalizing convention plans since Tuesday, will outline details for a free six-month course in Bible study. "Since this past summer," Mr. MacPherson explains, "our customary service of providing free home-Bible study has stepped up its pace considerably. Due to the urgency of world affairs, it has become necessary to speed up our teaching work; hence the reason for this six-month course. Jehovah's Witnesses in Ontario Circuit 29 will attend to learn how to conduct the course while many interested persons in the Georgetown area will learn by their attendance at the assembly how to benefit from such Bible study." The program will be conducted around the theme "Teaching with a Sense of Urgency in the Time Remaining."

Mr. MacPherson has been a full time minister with Jehovah's Witnesses for 27 years. He graduated from the Watchtower Bible School of Gilead and has since held supervisory capacities in seven Canadian provinces as well as the Northwest Territories. Apart from these responsibilities he has travelled to the Maritimes and other parts of Canada on speaking tours and other special assignments. As principal speaker at the Georgetown assembly, Mr. MacPherson will also deliver the public discourse, "God's Way is Love" on Sunday afternoon.

Another feature of the assembly will be a baptism ceremony at which new ministers will be ordained. "No one will leave the assembly not feeling the urgency of the ministry and the importance of preaching the good news of God's Kingdom," Mr. MacPherson concludes.
