

## Committee Recommends R.C. Headquarters in Burlington

In the latter part of 1968 the Ontario Department of Education issued a Guide for The Reorganization of Roman Catholic Separate School Jurisdictions in the Province of Ontario. The Guide outlined the requirement to prepare a comprehensive report which would provide information and assist trustees and officials in the establishment and operation of new diocesan boards commencing January 1, 1969. The present boards appointed the following representatives to this committee and in turn, the committee appointed Messrs. Hogan and Hennessy, the Burlington and Oakville area superintendents of education to form the secretariat.

The committee has compiled and analyzed all data as outlined in the guide and made recommendations in certain areas for the attention of the County Board. Detailed basic information is included pertaining to the four boards dissolving on January 1, 1969. Certain aspects of the report, such as organization, include specific recommendations which the committee considered advisable for immediate consideration by the County Board. Mrs. Joe Hurst, wife of Acton's town clerk, has been appointed to the senate of the University of Guelph.

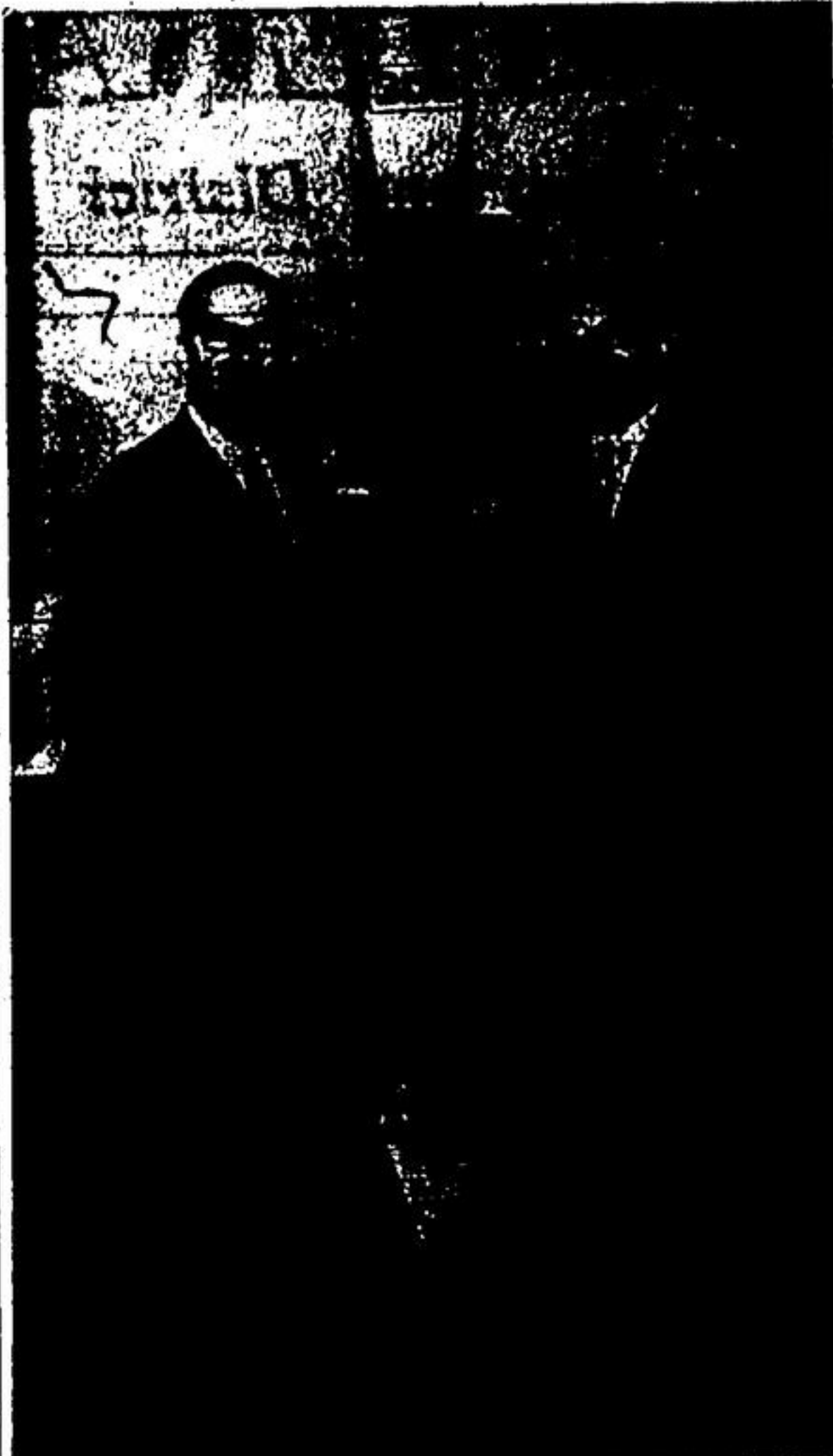

## Police Chief Advises Watch Safety 'Special'

Georgetown police chief Harley Lowe has asked The Herald's co-operation in urging local drivers to watch CTV's Safety Special Point Zero Eight, a timely reminder of the dangers of drink and driving, Thursday, December 10th. The widely-praised half hour special will be aired at 10:30 p.m.

Eight racing and rally drivers are shown undergoing scientific tests under the direction of Dr. H. Ward Smith, director of the Ontario Centre of Forensic Sciences.

Watched by the scientists, the drivers first complete the tests while sober. Their blood alcohol is gradually brought up to .08 per cent by means of a few mixed drinks. They then repeat the tests, designed to determine their driving ability, vision, reaction, depth of perception and judgement.

The drivers' gradual impaired ability, poor judgement and mistakes are presented as a warning to viewers. The Point Zero Eight study indicated that the permissible blood alcohol

level probably should not be higher than .05 per cent. The study was conducted at Harwood Acres, an Ontario racing track.

## Police Foil Car Theft Attempt, Nab Suspects

Alertness on the part of Georgetown police resulted in an attempted car theft being nipped in the bud, Sunday.

A pair of youths who had just started William Best's car in a Chapel Street driveway and were still figuring their escape route suddenly found themselves surrounded by police as their plans for cheap transportation were burst like the proverbial bubble.

Constable Bill Cunningham noticed them eyeing the car three quarters of an hour before they made the attempt. He radioed from the cruiser to Cadet Brian Farrell saying to keep the pair under surveillance in the downtown area.

Their movements were observed as they had a coffee in a restaurant and then returned to take the car only to have Constables Cunningham and Powell and Cadet Farrell spot their scheme before they had travelled a dozen yards.
