## Raiders Come Back Strong Win 4-2 Against Blades

Oakville Blades saw a 2-0 first period lead diminish into a 4-2 defeat at the hands of Georgetown Raiders Friday night in Suburban Junior O Hockey League action at the Oakville arena.

Dave Desmond and Charlie Burton fired the hosts into the 2-0 lead in the first 10 minutes of play but Raiders bounced back on goals by Brent McMullen, Al Stuttard Bill Dwyer and Jim Muir to register the win and pick up two points.

Desmond opened the scoring at the 5:48 mark of the initial stanza on a power play as he flipped Henry Hunting's pass behind Georgetown goaltender Bob Stoddard. Bob Clark started the play while Desmond and Hunting did a neat bit of passing before the red light flashed on to signify the goal.

Burton built the margin to two goals, two minutes and 40 seconds later as he flipped Hunting's rebound into the right corner but from then on it was all Georgetown.

McMullen ignited the Raider rally at the 16:21 mark of the first frame as he slapped a 25-footer over Oakville goaltender Ted Lensen's shoulder into the top left corner after a faceoff to the left of the Blade net.

Twenty-three seconds later Stuttard nipped the count as he jumped on a loose puck in front of the Blades' net and cashed in with a wrist shot into the right corner.

Dwyer fired the winning goal for the visitors with only two minutes and 34 seconds remaining in the second period as he backhanded the puck into the left corner from close range.

Muir added an insurance marker near the halfway mark of the third period as he rapped Al Stuttard's rebound past Lensen while Oakville was one man short.
