**Give a Life for Christmas**

That request, or slogan, had been heard before but there seems nothing wrong in saying it again at this time of year.

For some reason, Canadian drivers listen carefully and make safe driving week (Dec. 1 to 7) one of the safest high-way weeks of the year. Then they spend the rest of the month making up for it by being involved in more accidents than at any other time of year.

"Give a life for Christmas." It isn't so difficult. Just don't hit another car with your car. Don't run your car off the road. Defensive drivers will be careful, but not everybody has yet been exposed to the Canadian Highway Safety Council's course in defensive driving. So here are some things to remember, as you head into winter driving and holiday cheer.

**GIVE HIM ROOM**

First of all, that cheer. If you feel liquor makes the celebration, then patronize your local taxi or bus companies. If you MUST drive, confine your consumption to a drink per hour, or allow an hour for each drink before driving.

And if you take these precautions, look out for the driver who hasn't. He won't be hard to spot on slippery roads. Give him room and you may save his life, or even your own.

For just plain driving, remember there are going to be more cars on the road in the holiday season; they may be moving a bit more slowly, but they are not going to be under as close control as in dry, clear weather. So allow more room, both for other cars around you and for the possible errors or loss of control of other drivers.

Remember that the time of greatest hazard is in the early stages of a new snowfall, or after a light snowfall, which will grease the roads far more than a heavy snowfall.

**MAKE SURE**

Have your car checked for winter driving, making sure of the tires. Snow tires are good, chains are even better and studs can be effective, but only on ice (and they tend to lose effectiveness as they wear down).

NEVER drive with your windows obscured by snow, ice, or steam, and when cleaning the windows, clean off all LIGHTS as well - slush tends to collect and freeze on them and eventually obscure them altogether.

These are basic and sensible rules, a sort of winter application of Defensive Driving.

Do everything you reasonably can to avoid accidents.

Be cautious, careful and alert. Watch out for the other guy.

**Quick Southern Pecan Pie**

1 cup sugar  
1/4 cup melted butter  
1/2 cup corn syrup

3 well beaten eggs  
1 cup pecans  
1 unbaked pie shell

Mix sugar, syrup and butter; add eggs and pecans. Pour into pie shell. Bake at 400 degrees for ten minutes; reduce heat to 350 degrees and bake 30 to 35 minutes longer. Serve either hot or cold. Decorate pie with pecan halves as a border. As an added delight, top with slightly sweetened whipped cream.
