**Expect 3200 More Students County Schools in September**

The new Halton Board of Education will barely have time to get organized before it will have to start considering expansion.

On January 1 the county board will replace 10 local boards and take control of 85 schools with over 45,000 students, including Georgetown's public and high school boards and six public schools.

However, it has been projected that there will be another 3,200 public school pupils in September, 1969 and 2,100 more pupils in September 1970.

High school enrolment in the county is expected to increase by over 1,000 students next September.

the county board should consider providing.

Since a number of county schools do not have learning resource centres, it is suggested the new board develop a long range plan to provide these rooms in all schools within five years.

**Clinic Treatment For Teen Drinker**

A Georgetown teenager was remanded to the provincial clinic for alcoholics for a period not to exceed 90 days when he appeared for sentencing in county court Wednesday on a charge of drinking while a minor.

Provincial judge J. R. Black told the youth that he was imposing a different sentence than usual because it was the youth's third conviction within a year.

At least one youth appears in provincial judge's court each week for consuming alcohol under the age of 21, and if convicted, they are usually fined about \$100 and put on probation.

Under the heading new construction the report states: "An analysis of current enrolments, accommodation and projected enrolments will show a need for an extensive building program."

Because of increased enrolments as well as transportation problems, some current school boundaries may have to be changed.

When the idea of the county school boards were introduced the Department of Education said the purpose was to provide equal educational opportunity for every Ontario child. ISOC says this goal is to be attained then the necessary school structures will have to be provided.
