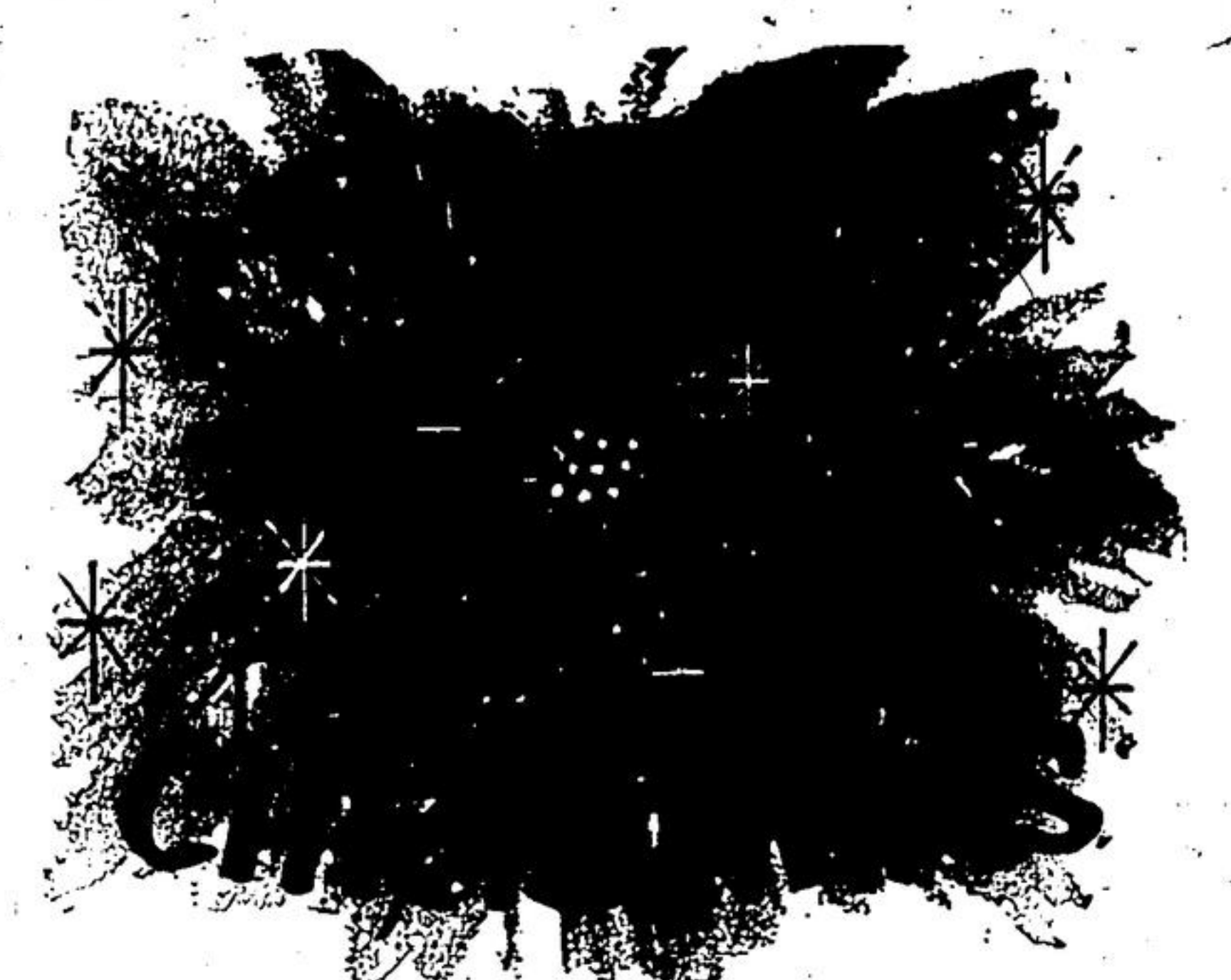
Invite Public to Find Out About Mormonism
