

Merchants Rip Raiders To Regain First Place

The Milton Merchants used their power play to great advantage Friday night to post a 11-4 win over the Georgetown Raiders in the Suburban Junior C hockey league.

The Merchants rattled home 4 of the goals while the Raiders were short-handed for the victory which lifted them back into first place in the league standings.

Rick Cole had another big night for the winners as he scored four goals and set up another for a five-point night.

Ted Hood had two goals and a pair of assists for the Merchants while Don Hearn scored twice and assisted on another.

Defenceman Ken Parton had a four point evening as he scored one goal and added three assists. Marty Seeds, with two goals and two assists, and Kip Tuckwell got the other Milton goals.

Frank King was a one man show for Georgetown as he netted all four of their goals in the second period just minutes apart and another two in the third stanza, just 30 seconds apart.

The Merchants took a 2-0 lead in the first period on goals by Seeds and Cole as even goalie Lloyd Vaughan got into the scoring act.

Vaughan threw an assist when he cleared a pass to Lawrence, who relayed it to Cole for his first goal of the night.

The Merchants scored seven goals in the middle period, four of them on powerplays.

Hearn scored at the 3 second mark to give Merchants a 3-0 edge with the Raiders two men short and Hood added the 4th Milton goal seconds later.

Milton had 14 minor penalties and one major in the game while the Raiders picked up 9

minors, a major and a misconduct.

Barry Elliot of the Merchants took a five min. to penalty when he crashed into Georgetown goalie Bob Stoddard in the second period.

Stoddard suffered a back injury and was unable to finish the game and he was replaced by Ron Clives in the Raider net.

Defenceman Brad Johnson of Georgetown got a fighting major for a scuffle with Merchants Ted Hood, who received a minor for his part.

A Bike for Christmas? Use These Safety Tips

Parents who gave bicycles as gifts for children during the holiday season should provide a safe-driving program for the youngsters to follow.

Bicycle riding is good preparation for young people who will one day drive automobiles, but only when the cycling privilege is given along with a thorough explanation of safety rules.

Here are some basic safety rules for young cyclists to learn and follow:

- Ride only in safe places, away from traffic wherever possible.
- When riding along the outside of a line of parked cars, watch for opening car doors.
- Signal on all stops and turns.
- Always yield the right of way to pedestrians.
- Never ride two persons on a bike.
- Wear bright, light-colored clothing that can be easily seen

by motorists in daylight, and in headlight beams at night.

— Keep the bicycle in good riding condition. Ask an older person to give your bike regular "safety inspections" and help with any repairs it needs until you can do the work well yourself.

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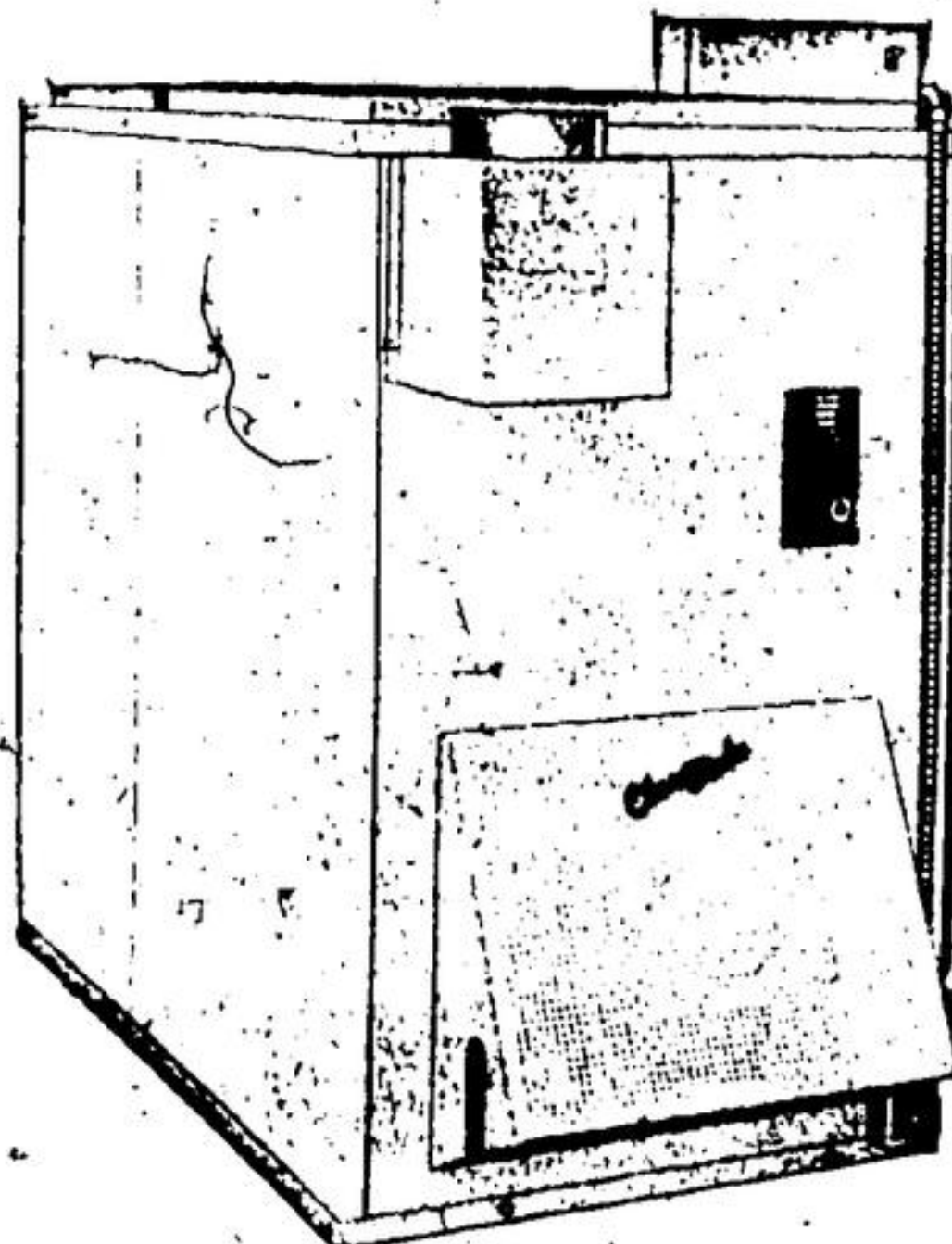
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
