Shakespeare had some excellent advice for pedestrians at intersections; (Julius Caesar, Act V, Scene I). "Stir not until the signal."

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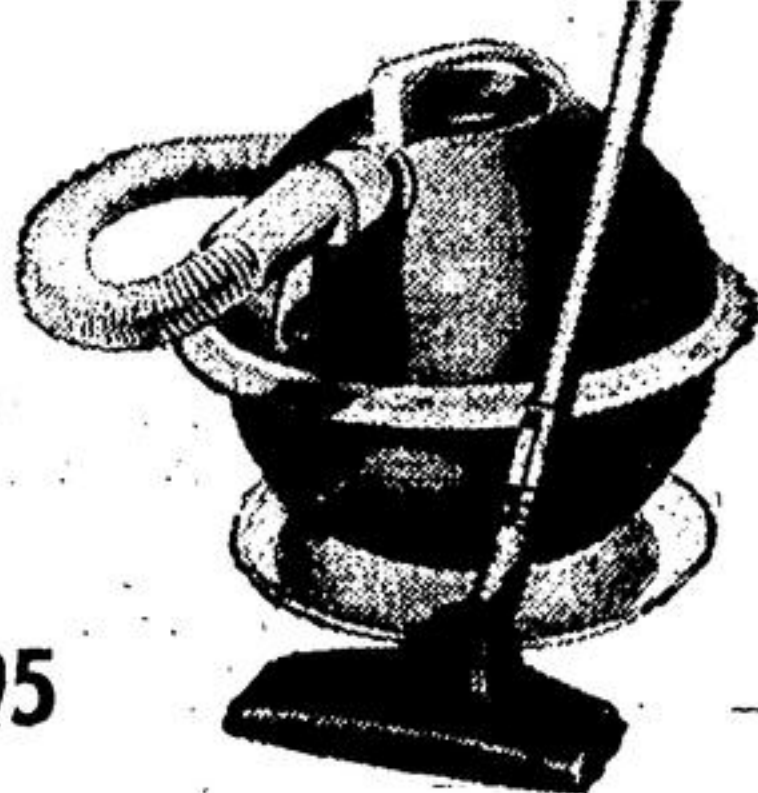
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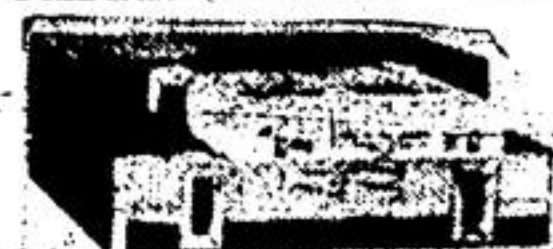
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
