## Two Georgetown Flyers on Biafra Relief Flight Crew

Two of the eight man crew flying Canada's only relief plane to Biafra, are Georgetown men, Roland Sparling, Duncan Drive and Dennis Hughes, Elcanor Crescent.

The Lockheed Super Constellation left Tuesday from Montreal to begin the long flight to the island of Sao Tome, in the Gulf of Guinea, five hundred miles from Biafra. From this volcanic island it will carry 21 tons of supplies nightly making two trips a night. The night flights are necessary to avoid anti-aircraft fire.

The plane was bought from Nordair, the only Canadian airline still operating the three tailed craft, for \$108,000. Operating cost for the three month venture will be close to \$500,000.

Most of the crew are Nordair employees on leave of absence except the two local men, who, as former employees, were asked by the pilot to come along. Mr. Sparling is mechanic engineer and Mr. Hughes electronic engineer.

This first Canadian civilian airlift of food and medicine into the beleaguered country, was organized by a group of

volunteer agencies and churches of all denominations across Canada, and is known as Canairrelief. The move was sparked by the Overseas Relief Committee of the Presbyterian Church and Oxfam, but quickly gained the support of church groups of all denominations.

Marking them as members of the 'Canairrelief' the crew wear white jump suits with a red insignia sporting a maple leaf and 'Canairrelief' on it.

The only cargo on the flight to Sao Tome will be one thousand pounds of drugs given by the students of Neil McNeil high school in Toronto, since the plane will be packed with a spare engine, radio, a Jeep, donated by Ford, and six motorcycles. The supplies which will be flown into Biafra are landed at Sao Tome by ship or plane, then transported by the relief planes.

The drugs donated by the students of Neil McNeil high school were handed over in an impressive ceremony at the airport Friday morning, when more than one hundred churchmen and their guests gathered to give their blessing to the venture.

Mr. Osborne ties in the disappearances with recent sightings of a huge bird, which he said he originally took for an owl, but which his son Mark claims fits the description of a Golden Eagle.

If it is an eagle, it's likely the pets were plucked from the ground and carried off.

Mr. Osborne said it would explain scratch and bite marks on some of his small goats, and similar wounds on another bound.

Last month sons Ed and Ted were approaching the farm in a car when a very large bird, which could have been an eagle, swooped low over the road.

Mr. Osborne has since moved his small goats into the barn and advises others in the area with pets or small livestock to do the same.
