

# 'Ric' Caruso New President of Ontario Lacrosse Association

A Georgetown businessman, Enrico "Ric" Caruso was elected president of the Ontario Lacrosse Association, Saturday in Kitchener. He steps up from the vice president's post.

During the past 20 years, Caruso has been with both the OLA and CLA in various executive capacities.

In taking on the OLA presidency he has inherited the problem of reorganization in the senior series, giving new life particularly to senior A lacrosse which suffered most by the loss of talent to the NLA last season.

Caruso was convener of the senior A series last season and is familiar with most of the problems that faced the senior A clubs.

The 63 voting delegates among the 250 who attended the OLA annual convention also admitted five teams, Waterloo to the senior ranks, and New Hamburg, Cornwall, Niagara Township and Whitby to the junior division.

Voted to replace Caruso as first vice president and senior B convener was Bill Brunskill of Huntsville, last year's second vice president. Promoted to replace Brunskill was Bob Sinclair of Toronto, third vice president in 1968.

Jeff Heymans of Woodstock was chosen third vice president Stan Martin of Bramalea was elected secretary and Gerry Lang of Port Credit, treasurer.

The late draw saw rinks skiped by Helen Archer and Glad

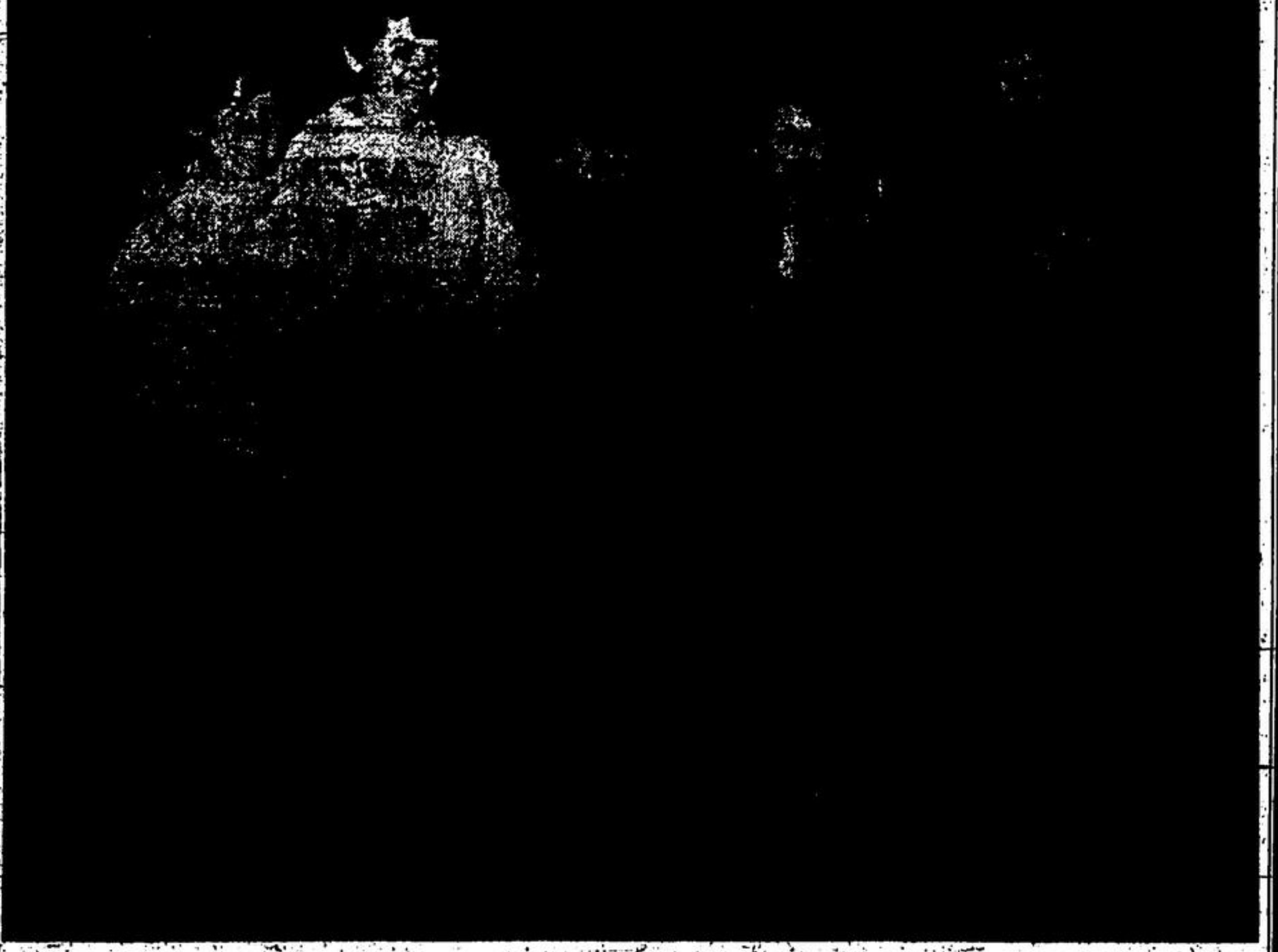
Robinson tie with 26 points though the Archer rink was given first place as high two game winners.
