

Says East End Open Ditch Dangerous Safety Hazard

Colin Blight, chairman of the Municipal Safety Committee, recently laid four questions before council Monday night.

"Why are open excavations and ditches still not fenced? Who is the Safety Officer? Why is the by-law not being enforced? and Who is the representative on the Safety Committee of Council?" were the questions.

Mayor Wheldon Emmerson explained that under the terms of the by-law passed last year, the building inspector and the safety officer were jointly responsible for enforcing this by-law. Rather than one council representative of the Safety Committee, the mayor contended the Safety Committee should report to council as a whole.

"The safety officers are building inspector Walter Pacholik and safety officer Fred Harris," stated the mayor.

Cr. Ric Morrow described an open ditch between the backyards of the houses on Raylawn and the rear of the Eagle Bliss property as over his head in depth, and during a mild spell almost filled with water. "To make the situation more dangerous, the ditch is not a gradual slope, but almost a cliff" he added.

Cr. William Smith recalled the money had been provided for the pipe and the pipe brought to put this ditch underground, but at the last moment the town found they had no legal easement. "That's where we are now," he remarked, "but we still hope to have it done by spring."

The Safety Committee will be asked to attend the next administration committee meeting to discuss deficiencies in the by-law.

Three District Car Accidents Sat.

Twelve motor vehicles were involved in five crashes on Georgetown's outskirts this week.

Ontario Provincial Police said one of three Saturday night accidents in the immediate area occurred on Maple Avenue W. just beyond Georgetown's western limits when a car operated by William Varley of R.R. 2, Georgetown collided with parked cars owned by Kenneth Langdon Jr. and Samuel Penrice both of Georgetown.

Constable Penrice, the investigating officer, placed damage at \$1200 to the Penrice car, \$200 to the Langdon car, and \$700 to Varley's car.

Varley was treated at Georgetown Memorial Hospital for underdetermined injuries. The accident happened at about 10:30 p.m.

An hour later, a three car accident on the Hwy. 7 hill on the east side of Norval involved cars driven by three Brampton men, Colin R. Pipell, Cecil William Daye, and Bruce Arthur Johnston. C.A. Norris estimated damage in this one at \$1500 to Daye's car, \$600 to Norris and \$25 to Johnston.

The other Saturday accident involved cars operated by Clarence Cress of Mississauga, and Albert Porter of Georgetown, and resulted in just \$90 damage. That happened at Norval at about 5 p.m.

Wednesday, January 22, a car-transport collision on Highway 7 a few feet east of Georgetown limits did \$200 damage to a car driven by Margaret Athery of Georgetown and \$25 to a tractor-trailer driven by Ronald Newton of Brampton.

Sunday afternoon, \$150 damage was done to a car driven by Kenneth Miller of Georgetown, and \$100 to one driven by William Wilson of Georgetown when they hit on the east end of the River Drive bridge just outside Georgetown limits.
