### Four Million Dollars to Publicize Milk

Special speaker at the Halton County Milk Committee meeting was Bob Mercer, head of Public Relations for the Ontario Milk Marketing Board. He stated that \$4,250,000 was now being spent on publicizing milk and milk products throughout Ontario. This involves TV, radio, billboards, magazines, and recent full page ads in daily newspapers.

Orval Guy, vice chairman of the Ontario Milk Marketing Board, discussed past and proposed activities of the board. Francis Redelmeier, the new zone director of the O.M.M.B., replacing Morris Beatty of Milton, spoke briefly. Ed Duncan O.M.M.B. fieldman, stated that he was available to assist producers who are having trouble with their Gel Test, and also suggested that these producers take part in the Ontario Mastitis Control Program. Joe Brent Dairy Commission fieldman for Halton and Peel stated that we must continue to improve the quality of our products.

Sam Harrop was returned as president for 1968, with Mac Alexander as vice president. V. J. Lawrence as secretary-treasurer. Brock Harris is representative to the Halton Farm Safety Council, and Bruce McClure is representative to the Halton Federation of Agriculture. Directors chosen to a three year term were John Bird, Russell Hurren, V.J. Lawrence, Bruce McClure, James Reid. Directors continuing for two years are Mac Alexander, John Kitching, Ford Wickson, Colin Marshall, Brock Harris. One year directors are Craig Reid, Sam Harrop, Fred Nurse, George Pelletier, and Gordon Sinclair.

### Certificate Again For Fire Prevention Bur.

Winners in the 1968 fire prevention scrapbook competition of the National Fire Protection Association have just been announced and once again the Halton Fire Prevention Bureau has been awarded a "special recognition" certificate for an outstanding county-wide fire prevention campaign.

Two other county fire agencies, one in Renfrew County and one covering Leeds and Grenville areas, were also awarded certificates in the 1968 contest. There were 284 Canadian communities and 224 from the United States in the 42nd annual NFPA competition.

The Halton bureau comprises firefighters from the county's fire departments and others interested in fire prevention, who meet monthly in Milton to plan and carry out fire safety campaigns across the county. This year's scrapbook, compiled by the public relations committee, totalled 218 pages and included samples of press releases and clippings, photos, literature, radio scripts and minutes of Bureau meetings.

Oakville Fire Department, one of the bureau's members, also won a major award in the contest this year. The Oakville scrapbook was judged first for all of Ontario in the contest for municipalities with a population

### West Indies Birds Makes Interesting Speech Topic

Dr. and Mrs. L. E. Jaquith were the guest speakers at the January meeting of the Georgetown and District Naturalists Club, their subject being "Birds of Trinidad and Tobago." They told of seeing 116 different species of birds during their two week visit to these islands. They were surprised that very few of our birds winter there although the meadowlark is common. The laughing gull was the only gull or shore bird found.

They were fascinated by the variety of hummingbirds. The white tailed hummingbird sings in groups and they were fortunate enough to observe one of their concerts.

The restaurants set out pans of raw sugar for the birds. Such colourful creatures as tanagers, honeycreepers, and cardinals come to feed and entertain the guests. Such unfamiliar birds to Canadians as trogons, toucans (with their large bills), and motmot (with their curious racket tail) were all seen. Thousands of scarlet ibis were sighted at a sanctuary. Parrots were also found flying free.

They said that the hurricane in 1964 had a devastating effect on the bird-life there. A colony of parakeets is now established in an area where they were not formerly found after having been blown there during the storm.

Trinidad and Tobago are a bird-watcher's paradise with inns and sanctuaries catering to their interests. Mrs. Jaquith told its historical background and present-day activities.
