

CWOSSA Wrestling Championship Belongs To Georgetown Mat Men

The pressure will be on Georgetown District High School wrestlers when they take the mats in the All-Ontario Wrestling finals in North Bay March 7 and 8.

On the strength of an impressive victory in the CWOSSA tournament here in which they ran up 142 points and captured 8 individual championships the Georgetown grapplers will go into the big one as favourites.

Coach Joe Ingarozza's matmen shook off a late challenge by Southwood of Galt to dominate the final session Saturday night and grab the ticket to North Bay by a margin of 16 points.

I was Georgetown's fourth successive CWOSSA title, and engineered over 22 other hopes, in the third biggest wrestling tournament in the province. It ran all day Saturday con-

cluding after 10 p.m.

A team win in this one is the big plum since the triumphant school gets to send its entire wrestling team to the North Bay showdown. The other schools will be represented there by only their champions.

Six hundred spectators watched the hosts' school take championships in the 90 pound class with Tiger Joe Fobert, the 98 pound class with Norm Ferguson, 106 pound class with Clive Llewellyn, 136 pound class with Vince Graham, 141 pound class with Doug Hills, and 148 pound class with Jack Walinga.

Two other Georgetown wrestlers made it to the finals before losing and so earned second place honours. Dave Hall was runner-up in the 115 pound class, and Sean-Bilsborrow runner-up in the 178 pound class.

Two other GDHS team members, Rejean Boulanger at 157 pounds, and Jim Breckenridge in unlimited, captured Consolation Division championships.

If there was a trophy for displaying heart and courage it would have gone to wrestlers from the Ontario School for the Blind who as well as earning 25 points earned the respect and admiration of the onlookers.

The enthusiasm of their sightless but certainly not spiritless, cheerleaders was exceeded only by the expression of esteem afforded the OSB wrestlers by the spectators as they accepted their trophies.

Traffic Safety officer Arnold Vanclief of the Georgetown Police Association presented the awards donated by that organization.

A special award for the tournament's outstanding wrestler went to Wenzel of Eastwood who, with a record of 26 wins and no defeats, was the unanimous selection of the coaches.

Staff members Lyn McLaren, Gerry Thompson, Bill Bingham, John Todd and D.L. Finn with the aid of a number of students ensured the tourney's smooth operation.

TOWN HIRING OWN PLUMBING INSPECTOR

Georgetown will have to hire its own plumbing inspector after September 1st, a letter from the Halton County Board of Health informed council Monday night.

The Board of Health plans to discontinue this service which they have carried on throughout most of the county. They contend they cannot find enough inspectors, and the plumbing task interferes with the mandatory jobs of food inspection, septic bed inspection, and restaurant inspection.

While the town charges the plumbing inspection fees, 70% of it has been remitted to the county to cover the service.

Reeve Hunter pointed out that the town paid \$9,000 to the county last year for plumbing inspection, and contended they could hire a town inspector for that.

Deputy Reeve Arthur Speight urged the hiring of an inspector for the town, the township

and Acton, with the cost to be shared equally. He was doubtful if there would be enough to do in Georgetown alone to warrant a full time man.
