

# Neilson - Williams Team Wins School Winterfest Car Rally

Car No. 4 driven by K. Neilson with B. Williams the navigator was the only one of 50 cars entered in the Georgetown high school winter car rally to pick up no penalty points and consequently won the first of what will likely be an annual event, Sunday.

The rally was held in conjunction with the school's Winterfest.

The Neilson - Williams team finished with all of their 210 points, six more than the second place team of J. Freeman, driver and J. Riley, navigator. Third was taken by K. Maidment, driver and L. Moors, navigator.

First and second teams were presented with gasoline vouchers and trophies, and third place was worth a car wash and cup.

The rally course wound from the high school through Stewarttown, Glen Williams, Belknap, Cheltenham, Terra Cotta, Glen Williams again and back to the school.

Cars were started in order of registration. The first left the school at 10:30 a.m. and the last finished checked in at 2:40. Check points were located at the school, staffed by Paul Gibson, Nick Shorten, Phyllis Miersma and John Gibson, and at Terra Cotta staffed by Bill Adcock and Bob Pelletier.

Ideally, cars covered the course in 35 to 95 minutes clocking 86 to 39 miles.

Five penalty points were assessed for each mile or minute over the maximum allowed, 10 penalty points for each mile under the minimum and 15 penalty points for each minute under the minimum.

Officially starting the cars on their way with a green flag was the high school's newly-crowned Snow Queen Kim
