Concern for Others Best Antidote to 'Opting Out'

Cross Roads Africa was the theme at the regular dinner meeting of the Business & Professional Women's Club at the North Halton Golf and Country Club Monday evening.

Miss Mary Prentiss, B.A. who is studying for her 'masters' was the guest speaker, introduced by Mrs. Audrey Scott. Miss Prentiss was a 'Crossroader' last summer in the eastern part of Africa and headed a group of twelve young university students on the project.

The project and living with the natives in their village was a two way street, because those students going from Canada and the States learned as much from their hosts as they did from the visitors. The group was involved in three projects, the first, digging holes for the planting of trees for a two and a half mile stretch of road, the second whitewashing and repairing the village library but the major one was the building of a bridge over a small river so that trucks could go to the village for the coffee from the mill which was the chief export of the village.

This work was all undertaken and planned by the group with help from the villagers, their tools were most primitive. There was no gravel for the bridge so the girls of the team carried large stones for two miles to the site and then sat for days, chipping these large stones into gravel size pieces, while the young men did the heavy work and engineering.

After the showing of slides of their work, Miss Prentiss displayed many mementos of native culture which were most interesting. A gift was presented with the sincere thanks of the club.

During the business portion of the meeting invitations were read from Bracebridge to a seminar, from Islington, also for a seminar and from Newmarket-Unionville to attend their International Night celebrations. Notification was also received for the Provincial conference to be held in London in April. The meeting closed with the club benediction.

Mrs. Floria Nodwell reported on new legislation giving women workers more protection and forbidding discrimination in employment of women because of race, creed, colour, nationality or place of origin and also ensuring equal pay status with men.
