Liberals Consider Party Politics When Regional Government Comes

When regional government comes to Halton and Peel counties, Halton Liberals are seriously considering a slate of candidates for the regional council, according to Halton Liberal Association president, David Butler.

This would mean that municipal affairs minister Darcy McKeough's plan for regional government will have to be changed in some areas.

Under McKeough's blueprint for two counties, 18 existing municipalities will be reduced to seven boroughs. Each of the seven boroughs will hold local elections and send representatives to the 21 seat regional council.

Direct Elections

If Halton Liberals want to run a slate of candidates, they will have to convince McKeough that the regional council should be elected directly.

Ontario Liberal leader, Robert Nixon has told local associations that it is their decision as to whether or not party politics should enter at the municipal level.

Butler has formed a six-man committee to study all aspects of the provincial plan.

"We're not jumping to conclusions," Butler said in an interview. "We don't know exactly what the province has in mind for the two counties so that all we can do now is accept the fact that regional government in some form is coming."

Pool Ideas

The committee will also invite Liberals from associations to the east and west of Halton to pool ideas.

Already, the association has come up with a few objections.

"Regional education was rammed down our throats," Butler said, "and now we're faced with regional government in such a form that it appears McKeough and (education minister) William Davis didn't even discuss the two in context."

"We're now drawing up a report for Mr. Nixon stating our feelings. We have to do something in the legislature before it's too late."

Two Counties

Butler would also like to see more consideration given to establishing two regional governments based on the two counties. He noted that the Halton and Peel regional government will be three times the size of Metro Toronto — a situation that could see local government lose touch with the grass roots.

Within the context of regional government, entering a slate of Liberals for the top tier becomes very important, he said.

"I can't see a candidate for the regional council campaigning all over the two counties and spending all that money to get elected to a municipal council."

Party politics at the municipal level would also give the voter better service, he said.

LET'S PLAY BRIDGE

Every bridge player when he takes up the game learns the necessity of taking out trump. The old rules "always draw trump unless you have a good reason for not doing so" is as useful to the beginner as it is to the expert. The big difference is that the experienced players know the right times not to draw trump.

Here is an excellent example of the delay of drawing trump for a good reason. It occurred at the Acton Bridge Club. Two declarers made game and two went down on these cards.

South dealt with neither side vulnerable.

NORTH
S-J 9 5
H-Q 10 6 4 3
D-K J 9
C-Q 2

WEST **EAST**

The bidding:
SOUTH WEST NORTH EAST

Opening lead: Jack of clubs.
North is a little light for a

two level response. Even if North only bids one no trump, South will make a non forcing jump to three spades, and North will carry on to game in the sequence shown, South's three spade bid is forcing.

Declarer ducked the opening lead in dummy and won with the king. If East had played the ace, declarer could have played his king and gained an extra entry to dummy. Declarer is faced with three sure losers — two hearts and a club. At all costs he must avoid a diamond loser. This can be done if the diamond finesse works, but it also can be done if a heart trick can be set up. In order to try to set up a heart, declarer must use dummy's trump as entries.

At trick two declarer should lead a heart. East will win and can take the club ace but now must lead a trump or a heart. If East leads a trump, declarer should win in his hand and lead his last heart. This will be won by West. West cannot lead clubs or diamonds so he must also lead trump. Declarer can safely play dummy's nine and when this holds he is home free.

A heart is ruffed high and dummy re-entered with the jack of spades. Another heart is ruffed establishing dummy's fifth heart as a trick. The king of diamonds is the entry to this trick.
