ed it was perfectly all right to use the word "blind" and not to shy away from personal questions. He was asked how he told the time. He illustrated by running his finger over the dial of a braille watch. He was asked how he knew the denominations of bills. He showed various bills folded in different ways, some with corners turned in, some long ways, etc. Everyone may use a different method of folding, he explained but this is a common way to know the size of the bill. George Cohen, a public relations officer for the So-Rite Research Division of Canada, was brought here by Charlie Crimes, and Jeanette Dykstra, co-owners of the Towne Sewing Centre, on Main Street. They heard about his private war on blindness from his employers So-Rite, who also own International Lace, and Reliable Smallwares, with whom the Towne Sewing Centre does business, and asked him here as a public service. Many blind have seen eye dogs today because of the money raised by Mr. Cohen from lectures. Much of it he gives to the fund for seeing eye dogs.

George Cohen lost his eyesight in 1944 due to glaucoma. His accomplishments as a sightless person are - former public relations officer for the Canadian National Institute for the Blind, Quebec Division, for three years and now a public relations officer for the So-Rite Research Division. In this area he has helped develop sewing aids for the blind, cooking aids for the blind, art of make-up and recreational activities. He is an accomplished golfer and water skier, and has won a scholarship for sculpture at the Montreal Museum of Fine Art. None of the judges were aware of his blindness. He has also penned a column entitled "Let George Do It" for the last three years. Air Canada is about to honour him as the most travelled sightless man in Canada. It is believed they plan to present him with silver wings.
