Many Frustrations Balk Apartment Building Plan

Still trying for a building permit for a planned 48 suite apartment building on Mountainview Rd., N. John Thomas recited a long history of frustration to council on Monday.

First turned down by Planning Board and council, he said he had drawn his plans to specifications demanded last fall, then was stalled by a 'freeze' by-law which makes council the arbiter of any apartment to be built.

He had been told by the planning board, he said, that the 'freeze' wasn't intended to stop all apartment building, and that they considered his location a good one.

"I've been waiting for a hearing on the 'freeze' ever since but so far nothing seems to have happened," he remarked.

Recently he consulted the planning board again, he said, and was told that he has to apply for rezoning. They said it could get a copy of the new standards from the secretary, he said, but the secretary tells

him she can't find one. "The chairman said if I'm not satisfied I should take it to court. That's what I had to do for my last permit, but I can't see why this should be necessary when I've complied with all the requirements," he concluded.

Cr. Sandy Mackenzie explained that one drawback is that the present sewage system will not serve an apartment in this location without a new pumping station. And council is waiting for permission from the Ontario Municipal Board to proceed with this.

Cr. Ern Hyde said that there is actually no zone designation for apartments in local by-laws, so that rezoning is not a question. Permission is necessary for apartments in any zone in town, he said.

Mayor Emmerson told Mr. Thomas council would review his case, but promised no quick solution.
