

THE DISTRICT AT A GLANCE

SNEELGROVE — Conventions costing \$4,207 in Switzerland, Colorado, California, Texas, Newfoundland, Alberta, Quebec and Ottawa were approved this week for staff and councillors at Chinguacousy council meeting. Travelling the farthest will be deputy-revee Ed Blair, at present in England and Scotland with township engineer Ken Conyns. He'll fly to Switzerland in July for a week's stay at the International Phys. Ed. convention.

MISSISSAUGA — A task force was officially organized by the Peel County Board of Education Monday to investigate the possibility of year-round education in the county schools. The committee will report their findings no later than the board's first meeting in October.

BRAMALEA — Sale of three acres of township-owned parkland behind Clark Boulevard is to be "contested to the end" by a group of ratepayers. At Chinguacousy council Monday night a petition denouncing sale of the land to the Peel Board of Education was presented. It contains 146 signatures.

ACTON — Because the number of telephones in the local service area of the Acton exchange has outgrown the present rate group, increases went into effect April 7. The increases boosted the monthly rate for a two party customer in Acton 20 cents higher. Individual residence rate is 25 cents higher.

MILTON — Plans to expand the Charles Hotel building at the corner of Main and Commercial streets corner was given a green light at Milton Committee of Adjustment last week. The owners, Paan Hotels Ltd., plan for a dining room, and lounge facilities in an expansion along the east and south sides of the old hotel.

ORANGEVILLE — Two men are dead as the result of a spectacular single vehicle crash Saturday evening one mile east of Mono Mills on Highway 9. Killed in the crash were Barry Black of Orangeville and Brian Jones of Beeton. Mr. Black has been a reporter for the Orangeville Banner for the past 18 months. Police said a faulty tie rod may have caused the car to leave the road, climb an embankment and roll over several times.

OAKVILLE — The takeover of Burlington by the city of Hamilton could backslash on Oakville taxpayers costing them up to three mills extra on their tax rate. Oakville councillor and veteran town planner Harry Barrett said this week that the town's council must vigorously fight the takeover of Burlington because involved in this proposal is a small section of Oakville which includes the two big oil refineries located northwest of Bronte.

ROCKWOOD — Increased compensation for volunteer firefighters was decided upon at a meeting of Rockwood village trustees last week. The rate paid firefighters will be brought more

jects to be carried out during this period in the Halton East Riding are as follows:

(A) Construction of new bridge and approaches at the Bronte Creek on Highway 2 just west of Bronte Road.

(B) Completion of the reconstruction and widening of the Queen Elizabeth Highway between the 9th Line interchange and the Kerr Street interchange.

(C) Reconstructing and widening of the Queen Elizabeth Highway from Kerr Street interchange westerly to Bronte Road. The tenders for this project are to be called within the very near future.

(D) Clearing and grubbing of the Highway No. 7 right of way between Georgetown and Acton in preparation for future construction.

(E) Resurfacing of the eastbound lanes of Highway No. 401 from Highway No. 10 westerly 7 miles.
