Last year the increase in the cost of a house was 10.15 per cent, but the increase has slowed down this year.

Land values, the big factor in the increase, have jumped from \$2,500 for a lot in 1963 to \$8,000 for the same lot today.

While farm land on the fringes of town has jumped 100% and more.

Mr. Sunnucks attributed part of the soaring costs of houses to the demands made on developers, and to the miles of red tape, and long delays, at all levels of government.

Citing farm land at \$3,000 an acre as the start of a development, he pointed out "This is raw land. Now we have to hire engineers, surveyors, town planners even to get the draft plan." The succeeding steps of Queen's Park, Department Municipal Affairs, Dept. of Highways, and municipal authorities, take up to two years, according to the realtor.
