Invalid 12 Years George Watson Dies

George Lee Watson, youngest son of the late Robert Watson and Clara McIntyre of Norval, died in Peel Memorial Hospital, Brampton on Tuesday, April 8, at the age of 54, following a lengthy illness. He was the grandson of Robert Watson Sr., one of the early settlers in the village of Norval.

He attended Norval Public School and worked at farming in the district. In later years he was employed with A.V. Roe & Co., at Malton for several years until he retired due to ill health when it was necessary to amputate one leg.

He was an enthusiastic fan of lacrosse and hockey and took a keen interest in the young men he knew who played on the local teams.

Being an invalid for the past 12 years he lived with his brother and family, Mr. and Mrs. Robert M. Watson, Woodward Ave., Brampton. He was well liked by all in the community and his ill health did not dampen his jovial personality.

He is survived by his brother Robert M. Watson and his sister Dorothy (Mrs. Edward McLean) Norval.

The funeral service was conducted by Rev. R. Walter Ridley of Norval United Church at the David A. McClure Funeral Home Brampton, on Thursday, afternoon April 10 with interment in Hillcrest Cemetery, Norval.
