## Publishing Firm Locates Here in Highway Building



Irwin-Dorsey Ltd., a publishing house specializing in publishing books for colleges and universities, established its executive office and warehouse in Georgetown three weeks ago. The company publishes books devoted exclusively to the fields of economics, business and social sciences.

The plant, near the corner of Sinclair and Guelph formerly housing Essex Kitchens will be renovated with the entrance having a cloistered appearance with pillars and a covered walk.

Irwin-Dorsey is a relatively new publishing company estab-

lished in 1967 in Nibleton Ontario as the Canadian subsidiary of two well known American companies while retaining its own completely separate and distinct organization. Richard D. Irwin Inc. started the business in 1933 and the Dorsey Press was created in 1958. Both companies are in Homewood Illinois.

The Canadian company Irwin Dorsey Ltd. has its own staff of officers with Richard E. Willis Jr. as president and field representatives covering all of Canada. Robert L. Roan, Fagan Drive, Georgetown, will represent the company in Ontario.

Mr. Willis has been in college textbook publishing since 1944 and has served at various times as field representative, divisional manager, director of sales, and vice president of Richard D. Irwin, Inc.

The company feels there is a real need for a publisher specializing in the ever changing fields of economics, business and social sciences. As a result they invite the submission of manuscripts in all these areas.

The first Canadian publication will be available soon, two volumes of Canadian History, compiled by Professor J.M. Bumstead of McMaster University.

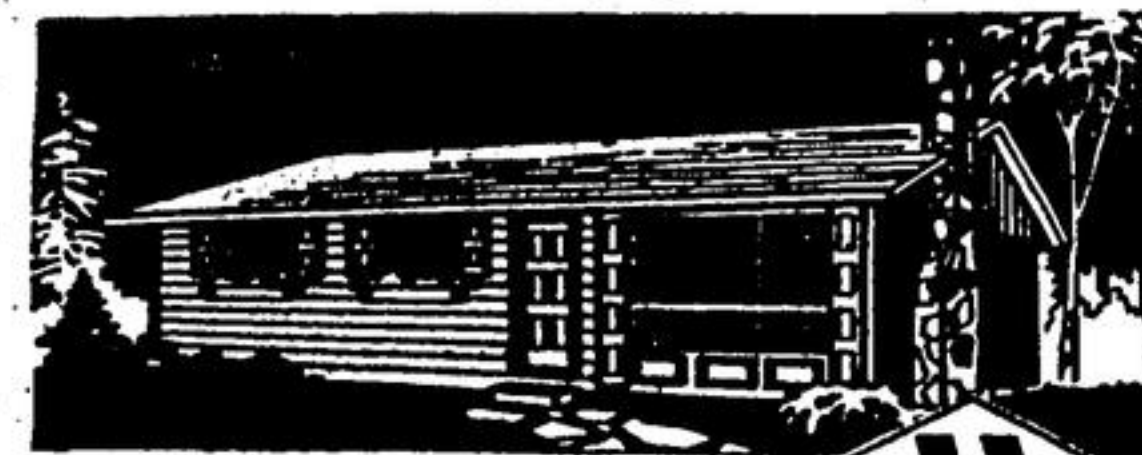
