Objects to Boundary Changes for Schools

RR 1, Limehouse (near Ballinafad)

Dear Sir:
The Halton County Board of Education found it more economical to shift the boundaries and as a result the pupils from Chapel Street and Park Public Schools who will be in Grades seven and eight next year will be attending Stewarttown Senior public school. It doesn't just end there. The grade seven pupils now attending Stewarttown SPS who reside in Esqueving from the North County Line, south on the Seventh Line to Highway 7 west to Acton will be shifted to an Acton public school. Why can't these pupils be allowed to complete grade eight at Stewarttown rather than be reverted to the k.p. to Grade Eight system? The board claims that these changes have been given careful consideration in view of the existing facilities and in a real effort to provide the Best Opportunity for All the children in our area. This can't really be directed at the people who live in the area mentioned above. We are going to be deprived of the more superior Stewarttown school and I for one strenuously object to this change. I object to the fact that my younger daughter, now attending Limehouse Jr. School will probably not be able to attend Stewarttown when she reaches grade seven, but object more so to the fact that my older daughter will be unable to finish her final year there.

It is evident that some of us are being lost in the shuffle while this collection of overpaid muddleheads try to tell us that they are concerned about all the children while making motions about economizing. I know only too well about the overcrowding of Chapel Street and Park public schools and realize that the situation can no longer continue. But I do wonder how the two Acton public schools will be able to accommodate 170 additional pupils who formerly attended Limehouse, Stewarttown and Speyside schools. Acton's population is increasing also and I can only conclude that when the Acton schools are 'bulging at the seams' the way some of the Georgetown schools are now, that once again our children will be juggled around. The Board says that boundaries will shift as the nature of population changes, as density increases or decreases (?) and as facilities are most readily available. It would not be difficult to prophesy that my younger daughter will run the gamut of the schools between Georgetown and Acton.

I am tired of reading in the Toronto papers how the rural children are going to be benefited by regional school boards. Before this larger board came into being our children were taught in first rate schools and we did well without the Halton County School board's high priced administration.
