Where Are Those Road Improvements?

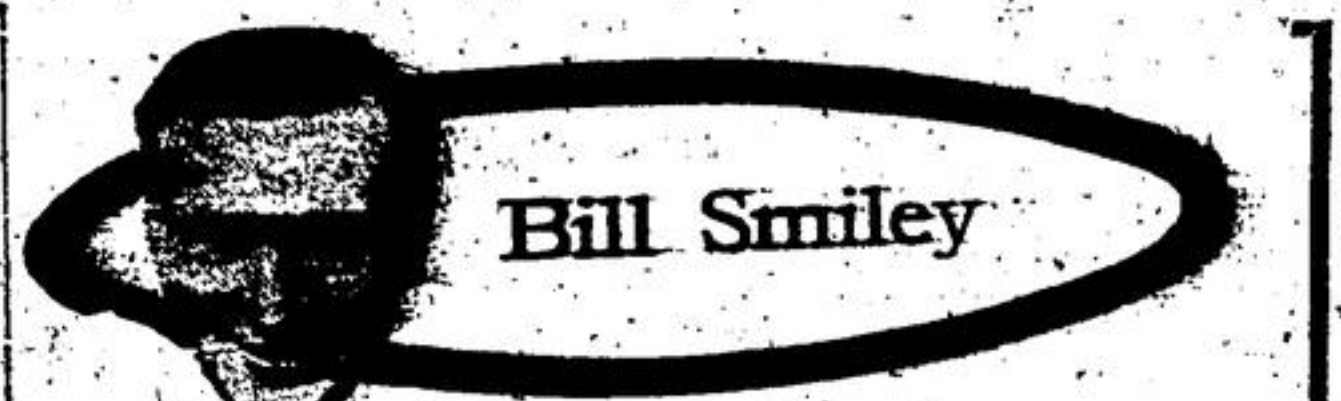
Dear Mr. Editor, Council should be commended on their plan of street improvement for 1969. It is to be commended.
