loner was told that there could be no promise of taxes being lowered, but there would be more efficiency with more qualified and better paid civic servants.

A bigger metropolis would also encourage better politicians and more decisions can be made on the local level, Mr. McKeough said.

George Miehms was dinner chairman, John T. Armstrong introduced the speaker and Sandy Mackenzie expressed thanks for his talk.

Fearing higher taxes a question to stall the majority who recognize the need for a change. A plebiscite is not in the Canadian tradition, he said, and is not being considered by Queen's Park.

A dinner guest expressed concern that there will be a loss of community identity in Georgetown when it is combined into a larger government unit.

Mr. McKeough countered with Burlington as an example of identity retention, then mentioned that today there is a global community and boundaries don't stop anymore at the town line.

Halton MPP Jim Snow, who had been commended by Mr. McKeough as a newcomer to parliament who had proved that a backbencher can make his voice heard, also spoke briefly.

Mr. Snow has been instrumental in having the government consider a national building code and has also proposed a sports complex for this area.

He said that his plan is not for government financing, but feasibility study with private capital then encouraged to participate. With half of Ontario's population within 35 miles, he said this would seem to be a more sensible location than in Toronto proper.
