Operated Ice, Fuel Business in Toronto
A former district farmer and later proprietor of an ice and fuel business in Toronto, Walter Hancock died in Toronto East General Hospital on May 22.

Mr. Hancock was born in Huntsville, Somerset, England, on November 5th, 1896, the second son of Fred Hancock and Sarah Ann Dauntton. He came to Canada in 1909, first residing on the All Owens property now owned by Sheridan Nurseries, and later on the town line, Chinguacousy, on the farm now owned by Howard Dolson. He was employed at the Beaumont Knitting Co. and operated a milk route from Skirrow farm on the 8th line, now owned by William Bennett. He served with the army in World War I.

He moved to Sprucedale and later to Toronto.

He is survived by his wife Lempi Kallio. He leaves ten children, Jack, Mary (Mrs. George Davidson) and Dorothy (Mrs. D. White) of Toronto, Fred of Ottawa, Walter and Anne (Mrs. Jack Timleck) of Georgetown and Betty (Mrs. Sam Finnsamore) of Norval; Rosemarie (Mrs. H. Hayman), Elsie (Mrs. Ron Bell) and Diane (Mrs. W. Hazell) of Toronto.

He also leaves six sisters, Emma Jane (Mrs. George Seddon) and Margaret (Mrs. George Inglis) of Georgetown, Daisy (Mrs. Andy Hunter) of Glen Williams, Lucy (Mrs. John Conaghan) of Bramalea, Catherine (Mrs. J. Floyd) of Boutilliers Point, N.S. and Isabel (Mrs. Gordon Hayward), Ingelwood; 30 grandchildren and a number of great grandchildren.

He was predeceased by brother and sisters, Harold, Beatrice (Mrs. Septimus Thompson),

Rose (Mrs. Joseph Dishaw), Mary (Mrs. A. E. Atkinson), Lily, and Stewart.

Funeral service took place on May 5th at the Giffen and Mack Funeral Chapel and interment was in Pine Hills Cemetery. Six members of Branch 73, Royal Canadian Legion, were pallbearers, Fred Liberty, Grant Kimmett, Les Grant, Mervin Dempsey, Stan Ginno and Eric Jordan.
