**Teachers Find Nursery School Is Well Equipped**

Maple Nursery School was closed on Thursday, May 15, while teachers Mrs. Kathleen Hall and Mrs. Mary Goebel attended the convention of the Nursery Education Association of Ontario on 'The Teacher and Early Childhood Education.' Although the Georgetown teachers were there for only one day, the convention lasted from May 14 to May 17 and took place at Royal York Hotel in Toronto. They arrived shortly after 9 a.m. at University Settlement House Nursery School for a morning visit. After looking at indoor and outdoor equipment and facilities, they observed teachers and children for their morning program. Surprisingly enough the local school is much better equipped.

They also watched a swimming class of nursery children a large percentage of which were welfare children.

The teachers returned to the Royal York for the afternoon session. After registering, they were presented with a shopping bag of pamphlets such as craft books, reading lists, day nurseries lists etc.

They then attended demonstration workshops in art media, spontaneous play, language groups, creative movement and music. There were also displays

of toys, reading material, educational devices with each display staffed by knowledgeable people who demonstrated their products.

At 8.30 Mrs. Hall and Mrs. Goebel arrived home after a full but interesting day.

Teachers attended the conference from all of Canada, and even Jamaica sent a representative. Next year's conference will take place at the Lakehead.

**Peace Established Reality Says Witnesses' Leader**

"Peace on earth has come" stated Melville Taylor, presiding minister of the Georgetown congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses. He said this in announcing that delegates from the congregation will be attending the 'Peace on Earth' International Assembly of Jehovah's Witnesses scheduled to be held July 6 to 13 in Buffalo, New York.

"In spite of the protests, campus rebellions, brush fire wars and incidents which threaten war that are continually in the news, peace is already an established reality in the lives of Jehovah's Witnesses and will become even more solidly based in the near future" Mr. Taylor said. "Witnesses will be converging on seven cities in the United States, as well as Europe, Canada and the Far East to attend one of the 'Peace on Earth' International Assemblies of Jehovah's Witnesses.

"We are preparing for the largest total attendance at any series of our assemblies ever," Mr. Taylor said. "Families from the Georgetown congregation are making plans to go into Buffalo to demonstrate, not by a street march, but by living, working and worshipping together for eight days, that there do not have to be 'confrontations' because people have different political, ethnic or social backgrounds.

"Because Jehovah's Witnesses make practical application of the words of the 'Prince of Peace' in their daily lives" he continued, "the result is a strongly knit or peaceful people. Genuine love for God, for neighbour and for family rules out frantic competitions and jealousies so prevalent in human society in general."

Lectures discussion groups and costumed dramas of life in Bible times will be features of the program at each convention and will explain more about the way God's kingdom is going to bring total peace in every way to the earth Mr. Taylor concluded.
