Mrs. Kewley Back at School Refresher

Thousands of Ontario secondary school students are free of the classroom this summer. Now it's the turn of more than 150 secondary teachers who have become students at two Toronto secondary schools.

But it's not an easy transition.

Maurice Smith, who directs the modern language department at Toronto's Oakwood Collegiate Institute during the winter, talked about the refresher courses that he is directing for the teacher-students at Lawrence Park Collegiate Institute and East York Collegiate. Studying there this summer is Mrs. Jane N. Kewley of Georgetown District High School.

"We don't want to transmit facts," he said. "We want ideas. And the ideas which our teacher-students bring are liable to be trampled by their colleagues in the seminar course. That is a true seminar." The courses sponsored by the Ontario Secondary School Teachers' Federation, began June 30. They include chemistry, English, French, history, development reading, and mathematics.

The 1969 courses — a far cry from a decade ago when the emphasis was upon how-to-teach-this-fact — emphasize dialogue among the 155 teachers who have come from every part of the province, and evaluate the impressions they bring from their own classrooms.

Mr. Smith said he regarded the history course as particularly significant. The course, which has not been offered for some years, will take teacher-students out of the classroom to the Royal Ontario Museum and the Huronia site at Sainte Marie in the same way that many youngsters take field trips.
